AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to policies and procedures regarding hate crimes and establishing a hate crimes training program

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 840 of the executive law is amended by adding a new 2 subdivision 6 to read as follows:

6. The council shall, in addition:

- 4 (a) Develop, maintain and disseminate, in consultation with the division of human rights and the hate crime task force established pursuant to section two hundred sixteen of this chapter, written policies and procedures regarding the recognition of and response to hate crimes, as defined in article four hundred eighty-five of the penal law. Such policies and procedures shall make provisions for the education and training of new and veteran police officers on the recognition of and response to hate crimes; and
- 12 (b) Recommend to the governor, rules and regulations with respect to
 13 the establishment and implementation on an ongoing basis of a training
 14 program for all current and new police officers regarding the policies
 15 and procedures established pursuant to this subdivision, along with

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recommendations for periodic retraining of police officers. Such recommended rules and recommendations shall also be submitted to the temporary president of the senate and the speaker of the assembly.

§ 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed on or before such effective date.
