AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to bullying and cyberbullying

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The penal law is amended by adding a new section 270.40 to 2 read as follows:
- 3 § 270.40 Bullying and Cyberbullying.
- 4 <u>1. A person is guilty of bullying when he or she engages a willful</u>
 5 <u>course of conduct which involves harassment of a person between the ages</u>
 6 <u>of five and twenty-five.</u>
- 7 2. A person is guilty of cyberbullying when he or she engages in 8 bullying and harassment of a person who is between the ages of five and 9 twenty-five using an electronic communication device.
- 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in bullying or cyberbullying of a person or induce another person to engage in such bullying. It shall be unlawful for any person to retaliate against any person that reports any conduct prohibited by this section.
- 4. Any person who is eighteen years or older or an emancipated minor
 who violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, unless
 charged as a violation, at the discretion of the enforcing officer.
- 17 <u>5. Any unemancipated person under the age of eighteen who violates</u>
 18 <u>this section shall:</u>
- 19 (a) be guilty of a violation, punishable by a fine not exceeding one 20 hundred dollars,
- 21 (b) be guilty of a violation, punishable by a fine not exceeding two 22 hundred dollars on their second offense, or
- 23 (c) be guilty of a misdemeanor for each additional offense.
- 24 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
