AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to a ban on undetectable firearms, undetectable firearm receivers and undetectable ammunition magazines

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known as the "undetectable firearms act".
  - § 2. Findings. The legislature finds that:
- (1) Federal Bureau of Investigation data shows that more than fiftyseven percent of the murders that occurred in New York state in 2011 were perpetrated with a firearm;
- (2) digital manufacturing technologies, including computer numerical 8 control mills, 3-dimensional printers and laser cutting machines are quickly advancing so that they may soon be used to fabricate fully oper-10 ational firearm components; and
- 11 (3) some commercially available digital manufacturing technologies can 12 manufacture these components using materials that cannot be detected by 13 traditional metal detectors or x-ray imaging machines.
- § 3. The penal law is amended by adding a new section 265.50 to read 14 15 as follows:
- § 265.50 Ban on undetectable firearms, undetectable firearm receivers 16 17 and undetectable ammunition magazines.
- 18 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly manufacture, 19 import, sell, ship, deliver, transfer, receive or possess:
- 20 (a) any firearm:

- 1 (ii) any major component of which does not generate an image that accurately depicts the shape of the component when subjected to 2 3 inspection by the types of x-ray machines commonly used at airports; or
- (b) any receiver for a rifle or handgun manufactured by a person who 5 is not a licensed manufacturer:
  - (i) that is not detectable as a rifle or handgun by walk-through metal <u>detectors</u>; or
- 8 (ii) which does not generate an image that accurately depicts the 9 shape of the receiver when subjected to inspection by the types of x-ray 10 machines commonly used at airports; or
- 11 (c) any ammunition magazine manufactured by a person who is not a 12 <u>licensed manufacturer:</u>
- 13 (i) that, after removal of the spring and follower, is not detectable 14 by walk-through metal detectors; or
- 15 (ii) which does not generate an image that accurately depicts the 16 shape of the magazine when subjected to inspection by the types of x-ray machines commonly used at airports. 17
  - 2. For the purposes of this section:
- 19 (a) the term "firearm" does not include the frame or receiver of any 20 such weapon; and
- 21 (b) the term "major component" of a firearm means the barrel, the slide or cylinder, or the frame or receiver of the firearm. 22
- 3. This section shall not apply to any firearm which has been certi-24 fied by an agency of the United States as necessary for military intelligence applications and is manufactured for and sold exclusively to military or intelligence agencies of the United States.
- 27 4. A person who violates the provisions of this section shall be guil-28 ty of a class E felony.
- 29 § 4. The New York state police shall promulgate rules and regulations 30 necessary for the implementation of this act.
- 31 § 5. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 32 have become a law.
