AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to plastic bag reduction, reuse and recycling; to amend the state finance law, in relation to the reusable grocery bag fund; and to repeal certain provisions of the environmental conservation law relating thereto

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 27-2701 of the environmental conservation law, as added by chapter 641 of the laws of 2008, is REPEALED and a new section 27-2701 is added to read as follows:

4 <u>§ 27-2701. Definitions.</u>

5

1. "Department" means the department of environmental conservation.

6 <u>2. "Postconsumer recycled material" means a material that would other</u> 7 wise be destined for solid waste disposal, having completed its intended 8 end use and product life cycle. Postconsumer recycled material does not 9 include materials and byproducts generated from, and commonly reused 10 within, an original manufacturing and fabrication process.

11 <u>3. "Recycled paper bag" means a paper carryout bag provided by a store</u> 12 <u>to a customer at the point of sale that meets all of the following</u> 13 <u>requirements:</u>

(a) (1) Except as provided in subparagraph two of this paragraph,
contains a minimum of forty percent postconsumer recycled materials.

- 16 (2) An eight pound or smaller recycled paper bag shall contain a mini-17 mum of twenty percent postconsumer recycled material.
- 18 (b) Is accepted for recycling in curbside programs in a majority of

19 households that have access to curbside recycling programs in the state.

EXPLANATION--Matter in <u>italics</u> (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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1	(c) Has printed on the bag the name of the manufacturer, the country
2	where the bag was manufactured, and the minimum percentage of postcon-
3	sumer content.
4	4. "Reusable grocery bag" means a bag that is provided by a store to a
5	customer at the point of sale that meets the requirements of section
6	27-2703 of this title.
7	5. (a) "Reusable grocery bag producer" means a person or entity that
8	does any of the following:
9	(1) Manufactures reusable grocery bags for sale or distribution to a
10	store.
11	(2) Imports reusable grocery bags into this state, for sale or
12	distribution to a store.
13	(3) Sells or distributes reusable bags to a store.
14	(b) "Reusable grocery bag producer" does not include a store, with
15	regard to a reusable grocery bag for which there is a manufacturer or
16	importer, as specified in subparagraph one or two of paragraph (a) of
17	this subdivision.
18	6. (a) "Single-use carryout bag" means a bag made of plastic, paper,
19	or other material that is provided by a store to a customer at the point
20	of sale and that is not a recycled paper bag or a reusable grocery bag
21	that meets the requirements of section 27-2703 of this title.
22	(b) A single-use carryout bag does not include any of the following:
23	(1) A bag provided by a pharmacy.
24	(2) A nonhandled bag used to protect a purchased item from damaging or
25	contaminating other purchased items when placed in a recycled paper bag,
26	<u>a reusable grocery bag, or a compostable plastic bag.</u>
27	(3) A bag provided to contain an unwrapped food item.
28	(4) A nonhandled bag that is designed to be placed over articles of
29	<u>clothing on a hanger.</u>
30	7. "Store" means a retail establishment that meets any of the follow-
31	ing requirements:
32	(a) A full-line, self-service retail store with gross annual sales of
33	two million dollars or more that sells a line of dry groceries, canned
34	goods, or nonfood items, and some perishable items.
35	(b) Has at least ten thousand square feet of retail space that gener-
36	<u>ates sales or use tax.</u>
37	(c) Is a convenience food store, deli, foodmart, or other entity that
38	is engaged in the retail sale of a limited line of goods, generally
39	including milk, bread, soda, and snack foods.
40	(d) Is a convenience food store, deli, foodmart, or other entity that
41	is engaged in the retail sale of goods intended to be consumed off the
42	premises.
43	(e) Is not otherwise subject to paragraphs (a), (b), (c), or (d) of
44	this subdivision, if the retail establishment voluntarily agrees to
45	comply with the requirements imposed upon a store pursuant to this
46	title, irrevocably notifies the department of its intent to comply with
47	the requirements imposed upon a store pursuant to this title, and
48	complies with the requirements established pursuant to subdivision five
49	of section 27-2702 of this title.
50	§ 2. Section 27-2703 of the environmental conservation law, as added
51	by chapter 641 of the laws of 2008, is REPEALED and a new section
52	27-2703 is added to read as follows:
53	<u>§ 27-2703. Store operator responsibilities.</u>
54	1. On and after July first, two thousand twenty, a store, as defined
55	in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of this
56	title may sell or distribute a reusable grocery bag to a customer at

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1	the point of sale only if the reusable bag is made by a producer certi-
2	fied pursuant to this section to meet all of the following requirements:
3	(a) Has a handle and is designed for at least one hundred twenty-five
4	uses, as provided in this title.
5	(b) Has a volume capacity of at least fifteen liters.
6	(c) Is machine washable or made from a material that can be cleaned
7	and disinfected.
8	(d) Has printed on the bag, or on a tag attached to the bag that is
9	not intended to be removed, and in a manner visible to the consumer, all
10	of the following information:
11	(1) The name of the manufacturer.
12	(2) The country where the bag was manufactured.
13	(3) A statement that the bag is a reusable bag and designed for at
14	<u>least one hundred twenty-five uses.</u>
15	(4) If the bag is eligible for recycling in the state, instructions to
16	return the bag to the store for recycling or to another appropriate
17	recycling location. If recyclable in the state, the bag shall include
18	the chasing arrows recycling symbol or the term "recyclable", consistent
19	with the Federal Trade Commission guidelines use of that term, as
20	updated.
21	(e) Does not contain lead, cadmium, or any other toxic material that
22	may pose a threat to public health. A reusable bag manufacturer may
23	demonstrate compliance with this requirement by obtaining a no objection
24	letter from the federal food and drug administration.
25	(f) Complies with section 260.12 of part two hundred sixty of title
26	sixteen of the code of federal regulations related to recyclable claims
27	if the reusable grocery bag producer makes a claim that the reusable
28	grocery bag is recyclable.
29	2. (a) In addition to the requirements in subdivision one of this
30	section, a reusable grocery bag made from plastic film shall meet all of
31	the following requirements:
32	(1) On and after January first, two thousand twenty-one, it shall be
33	made from a minimum of twenty percent postconsumer recycled material.
34	(2) On and after January first, two thousand twenty-six, it shall be
35	made from a minimum of forty percent postconsumer recycled material.
36	(3) It shall be recyclable in this state, and accepted for return at
37	stores subject to any at-store recycling program for recycling.
38	(4) It shall have, in addition to the information required to be
39	printed on the bag or on a tag, pursuant to subparagraph four of para-
40	graph (d) of subdivision one of this section, a statement that the bag
41	is made partly or wholly from postconsumer recycled material and stating
42	the postconsumer recycled material content percentage, as applicable.
43	(5) It shall be capable of carrying twenty-two pounds over a distance
44	of one hundred seventy-five feet for a minimum of one hundred twenty-
45	five uses and be at least 2.25 millimeters thick, measured according to
46	the American Society of Testing and Materials standard D6988-13.
47	(b) A reusable grocery bag made from plastic film that meets the spec-
48	ifications of the American Society of Testing and Materials Interna-
49	tional Standard Specification for compostable plastics D6400, as
50	updated, is not required to meet the requirements of subparagraph one or
51	two of paragraph (a) of subdivision three of section 27-2701 of this
52	title.
53	3. In addition to the requirements of subdivision one of this section,
54	a reusable grocery bag that is not made of plastic film and that is made

55 from any other natural or synthetic fabric, including, but not limited

1	to, woven or nonwoven nylon, polypropylene, polyethylene-terephthalate,
2	or Tyvek, shall satisfy all of the following:
3	(a) It shall be sewn.
4	(b) It shall be capable of carrying twenty-two pounds over a distance
5	of one hundred seventy-five feet for a minimum of one hundred twenty-
б	five uses.
7	(c) It shall have a minimum fabric weight of at least eighty grams per
8	square meter.
9	4. On and after July first, two thousand twenty, a store as defined in
10	paragraph (c), (d) or (e) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of
11	this title, shall comply with the requirements of this section.
12	§ 3. Section 27-2707 of the environmental conservation law is REPEALED
13	and a new section 27-2707 is added to read as follows:
14	<u>§ 27-2707. Manufacturer responsibilities.</u>
15	On and after July first, two thousand twenty, a producer of reusable
16	grocery bags made from plastic film shall not sell or distribute a reus-
17	able grocery bag in this state unless the producer is certified by a
18	third-party certification entity pursuant to section 27-2709 of this
19	title. A producer shall provide proof of certification to the department
20	demonstrating that the reusable grocery bags produced by the producer
21	comply with the provisions of this title. The proof of certification
22	shall include all of the following:
23	1. Names, locations, and contact information of all sources of
24	postconsumer recycled material and suppliers of postconsumer recycled
25	material.
26	2. Quantity and dates of postconsumer recycled material purchases by
27	the reusable grocery bag producer.
28	3. How the postconsumer recycled material is obtained.
29	4. Information demonstrating that the postconsumer recycled material
30	is cleaned using appropriate washing equipment.
31	§ 4. Section 27-2709 of the environmental conservation law is REPEALED
32	and a new section 27-2709 is added to read as follows:
33	§ 27-2709. Department responsibilities.
34	1. (a) Commencing on or before July first, two thousand twenty, the
35	certification conducted by a third-party certification entity, submitted
36	under penalty of perjury, for each type of reusable grocery bag that is
37	manufactured, imported, sold, or distributed in the state and provided
38	to a store for sale or distribution, at the point of sale, that meets
39	all the applicable requirements of this title. The proof of certif-
40	ication shall be accompanied by a certification fee, established pursu-
41	ant to subdivision two of this section.
42	(b) A reusable grocery bag producer shall resubmit to the department
43	proof of certification as described in paragraph (a) of this subdivision
44	on biennial basis. A reusable grocery bag producer shall provide the
45	department with an updated proof of certification conducted by a third-
46	party certification entity if any modification that is not solely
47	aesthetic is made to a previously certified reusable bag. Failure to
48	comply with this subdivision shall result in removal of the relevant
49	information posted on the department's web site pursuant to subpara-
50	graphs (1) and (2) of paragraph (e) of this subdivision for each reus-
51	able bag that lacks an updated proof of certification conducted by a
52	third-party certification entity.
53	(c) A third-party certification entity shall be an independent,
54	accredited ISO/IEC 17025 laboratory. A third-party certification entity
55	shall certify that the producer's reusable grocery bags meet the

56 requirements of this section.

1	(d) The department shall provide a system to receive proofs of certif-
2	ication online.
3	(e) On and after July first, two thousand twenty, the department shall
4	publish a list on its web site that includes all of the following:
5	(1) The name, location, and appropriate contact information of certi-
6	fied reusable grocery bag producers.
7	(2) The reusable grocery bags of producers that have provided the
8	required certification.
9	(f) A reusable grocery bag producer shall submit applicable certified
	test results to the department confirming that the reusable grocery bag
10	
11	meets the requirements of this title for each type of reusable grocery
12	bag that is manufactured, imported, sold, or distributed in the state
13	and provided to a store for sale or distribution.
14	(1) A person may object to the certification of a reusable grocery bag
15	producer pursuant to this section by filing an action for review of that
16	certification in the superior court of a county that has jurisdiction
17	over the reusable grocery bag producer. The court shall determine if the
18	reusable grocery bag producer is in compliance with the requirements of
19	this title.
20	(2) A reusable grocery bag producer whose certification is being
21	objected to pursuant to subparagraph one of this paragraph shall be
22	deemed in compliance with this title pending a determination by the
23	court.
24	(3) Based on its determination, the court shall direct the department
25	to remove the reusable grocery bag producer from, or retain the reusable
26	grocery bag producer on, its list published pursuant to paragraph (e) of
20 27	this subdivision.
28	(4) If the court directs the department to remove a reusable grocery
29	bag producer from its published list, the reusable grocery bag producer
30	shall remain off of the published list for a period of one year from the
31	date of the court's determination.
32	2. (a) A reusable grocery bag producer shall submit the fee estab-
33	lished pursuant to paragraph (b) of this subdivision to the department
34	when providing proof of certification or recertification pursuant to
35	this subdivision and section 27-2707 of this title.
36	(b) The department shall establish an administrative certification fee
37	schedule that will generate fee revenues sufficient to cover, but not
38	exceed, the department's reasonable costs to implement this title. The
39	department shall deposit all moneys submitted pursuant to this section
40	into the reusable grocery bag fund established pursuant to section nine-
41	ty-seven-yyyy of the state finance law. Moneys in the fund shall be
42	continuously appropriated, without regard to fiscal year, to the depart-
43	ment for the purpose of implementing this title.
44	§ 5. Title 27 of article 27 of the environmental conservation law, as
45	added by chapter 641 of the laws of 2008, is amended by adding a new
	section 27-2702 to read as follows:
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47	§ 27-2702. Single use carryout bags.
48	1. (a) Except as provided in paragraph (e) of this subdivision, on and
49	after July first, two thousand twenty, a store, as defined in paragraph
50	(a) or (b) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of this title, shall
51	not provide a single-use carryout bag to a customer at the point of
52	sale.
53	(b) (1) On and after July first, two thousand twenty, a store, as
54	defined in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701
55	of this title, shall not sell or distribute a reusable grocery bag at
	the point of sale except as provided in this subdivision.

1	(2) On and after July first, two thousand twenty, a store, as defined
2	in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of this
3	title, may make available for purchase at the point of sale a reusable
4	grocery bag that meets the requirements of section 27-2703 of this
5	title.
6	(3) On and after July first, two thousand twenty, a store, as defined
7	in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of this
8	title, that makes reusable grocery bags available for purchase pursuant
9	to subparagraph two of paragraph (b) of this subdivision shall not sell
10	the reusable grocery bag for less than ten cents in order to ensure that
11	the cost of providing a reusable grocery bag is not subsidized by a
12	<u>customer who does not require that bag.</u>
13	(c) (1) On and after July first, two thousand twenty, a store, as
14	defined in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701
15	of this title, shall not sell or distribute a recycled paper bag except
16	as provided in this subdivision.
17	(2) A store, as defined in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision seven
18	of section 27-2701 of this title, may make available for purchase a
19	recycled paper bag. On and after July first, two thousand twenty, the
20	store shall not sell a recycled paper bag for less than ten cents in
21	order to ensure that the cost of providing a recycled paper bag is not
22	subsidized by a consumer who does not require that bag.
23	(d) Notwithstanding any other law, on and after July first, two thou-
24	sand twenty, a store, as defined in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision
25	seven of section 27-2701 of this title, that makes reusable grocery bags
26	or recycled paper bags available for purchase at the point of sale shall
27	provide a reusable grocery bag or a recycled paper bag at no cost at the
28	point of sale to a customer using a payment card or voucher issued by
29	the New York supplemental nutrition program for women, infants, and
30	children pursuant to section twenty-five hundred seven of the public
31	health law or an electronic benefit transfer card issued pursuant to
32	section ninety-five of the social services law.
33	(e) On and after July first, two thousand twenty, a store, as defined
34	in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of this
35	title, may distribute a compostable bag at the point of sale, if the
36	compostable bag is provided to the consumer at the cost specified pursu-
37	ant to subparagraph two of paragraph (c) of this subdivision, the
38	compostable bag, at a minimum, meets the American Society of Testing and
39	Materials International Standard Specification for compostable plastics
40	D6400, as updated, and in the jurisdiction where the compostable bag is
41	sold and in the jurisdiction where the store is located, both of the
42	following requirements are met:
43	(1) A majority of the residential households in the jurisdiction have
44	access to curbside collection of food waste for composting.
45	(2) The governing authority for the jurisdiction has voted to allow
46	stores in the jurisdiction to sell to consumers at the point of sale a
47	compostable bag at a cost not less than the actual cost of the bag,
48	which the legislature hereby finds to be not less than ten cents per
49	bag.
50	(f) A store, as defined in paragraph (a) or (b) of subdivision seven
51	of section 27-2701 of this title, shall not require a customer to use,
52	purchase, or accept a single-use carryout bag, recycled paper bag,
53	compostable bag, or reusable grocery bag as a condition of sale of any
54	product.
55	2. On and after July first, two thousand twenty-one, a store, as
56	defined in paragraph (c), (d) or (e) of subdivision seven of section

1	27-2701 of this title, shall comply with the same requirements of this
2	section that are imposed upon a store, as defined in paragraph (a) or
3	(b) of subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of this title.
4	3. (a) The operator of a store, as defined in paragraph (a) or (b) of
5	subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of this title that makes recycled
6	paper or reusable grocery bags available at the point of sale, shall be
7	subject to the provisions of the at-store recycling program established
8	pursuant to section 27-2705 of this title.
9	(b) A store that voluntarily agrees to comply with the provisions of
10	this title pursuant to subdivision seven of section 27-2701 of this
11	title, shall also comply with the provisions of the at-store recycling
12	program established pursuant to section 27-2705 of this title.
13	4. All moneys collected pursuant to this title shall be retained by
14	the store and may be used only for the following purposes:
15	(a) Costs associated with complying with the requirements of this
16	<u>title.</u>
17	(b) Actual costs of providing recycled paper bags or reusable grocery
18	bags.
19	(c) Costs associated with a store's educational materials or educa-
20	tional campaign encouraging the use of reusable grocery bags.
21	5. (a) A retail establishment not specifically required to comply with
22	the requirements of this title is encouraged to reduce its distribution
23	of single-use plastic carryout bags.
24	(b) Pursuant to the provisions of subdivision seven of section 27-2701
25	of this title, any retail establishment that is not a "store", that
26	provides the department with the irrevocable written notice as specified
27	in paragraph (c) of this subdivision shall be regulated as a "store" for
28	the purposes of this title.
29	(c) The irrevocable written notice shall be dated and signed by an
30 21	authorized representative of the retail establishment, and shall include the name and physical address of all retail locations covered by the
31 32	notice. The department shall acknowledge receipt of the notice in writ-
33	ing and shall specify the date the retail establishment will be requ-
34	lated as a "store", which shall not be less than thirty days after the
35	date of the department's acknowledgment. The department shall post on
36	its web site, organized by county, the name and physical location or
37	locations of each retail establishment that has elected to be regulated
38	as a "store".
39	§ 6. Title 27 of article 27 of the environmental conservation law, as
40	added by chapter 641 of the laws of 2008, is amended by adding a new
41	section 27-2712 to read as follows:
42	§ 27-2712. Enforcement.
43	<u>1. A city, a county, a city and county, or the state may impose a</u>
44	civil liability on a person or entity that knowingly violated this
45	title, or reasonably should have known that it violated this title, in
46	the amount of one thousand dollars per day for the first violation of
47	this title, two thousand dollars per day for the second violation, and
48	five thousand dollars per day for the third and subsequent violations.
49	2. Any civil penalties collected pursuant to subdivision one of this
50	section shall be paid to the office of the city attorney, city prosecu-
51	tor, district attorney, or attorney general, whichever office brought
52	the action. The penalties collected pursuant to this section by the
53	attorney general may be expended by the attorney general, upon appropri-
54	ation by the legislature, to enforce this title.
55	§ 7. Section 27-2713 of the environmental conservation law is REPEALED
56	and a new section 27-2713 is added to read as follows:

§ 27-2713. Preemption. 1 1. Except as provided in subdivision three of this section, this title 2 3 is a matter of statewide interest and concern and is applicable uniform-4 ly throughout the state. Accordingly, this title occupies the whole 5 field of regulation of reusable grocery bags, single-use carryout bags, б and recycled paper bags, as defined in this title, provided by a store, 7 as defined in this title. 8 2. On and after January first, two thousand twenty, a city, county, or 9 other local public agency shall not enforce, or otherwise implement, an 10 ordinance, resolution, regulation, or rule, or any amendment thereto, adopted on or after the effective date of this section, relating to 11 reusable grocery bags, single-use carryout bags, or recycled paper bags, 12 13 against a store, as defined in this title, unless expressly authorized 14 by this title. 3. (a) A city, county, or other local public agency that has adopted, 15 16 before the effective date of this section, an ordinance, resolution, 17 regulation, or rule relating to reusable grocery bags, single-use carryout bags, or recycled paper bags may continue to enforce and implement 18 19 that ordinance, resolution, regulation, or rule that was in effect 20 before that date. Any amendments to that ordinance, resolution, requ-21 lation, or rule on or after January first, two thousand twenty, shall be subject to subdivision two of this section, except the city, county, or 22 other local public agency may adopt or amend an ordinance, resolution, 23 regulation, or rule to increase the amount that a store shall charge 24 25 with regard to a recycled paper bag, compostable bag, or reusable 26 grocery bag to no less than the amount specified in section 27-2702 of 27 this title. 28 (b) A city, county, or other local public agency not covered by paragraph (a) of this subdivision that, before the effective date of this 29 30 section, has passed a first reading of an ordinance or resolution 31 expressing the intent to restrict single-use carryout bags and, before January first, two thousand twenty, adopts an ordinance to restrict 32 33 single-use carryout bags, may continue to enforce and implement the ordinance that was in effect before January first, two thousand twenty. 34 35 § 8. The state finance law is amended by adding a new section 97-yyyy to read as follows: 36 37 § 97-yyyy. Reusable grocery bag fund. 1. There is hereby established 38 in the joint custody of the commissioner of the department of environmental conservation and the comptroller a fund to be known as the "reus-39 40 able grocery bag fund". 41 2. The fund shall consist of all monies appropriated for its purpose, 42 all monies required by this section or any other provision of law to be 43 paid into or credited to such fund. Whenever a lawsuit results in a 44 civil judgment for expenses already paid for by the fund, that portion 45 of the civil judgment shall be paid into the fund. Nothing contained 46 herein shall prevent the department of environmental conservation from 47 receiving grants, gifts or bequests for the purposes of the fund as defined in this section and depositing them into the fund according to 48 49 <u>law.</u> 3. Monies of the fund, when allocated, shall be available pursuant to 50 51 section 27-2709 of the environmental conservation law. 52 4. Monies shall be payable from the fund on the audit and warrant of 53 the state comptroller on vouchers approved and certified by the commis-54 sioner of the department of environmental conservation.

55 § 9. This act shall take effect immediately.
