AN ACT to amend the state finance law, in relation to establishing the dedicated highway and bridge trust fund reform act

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as
the "dedicated highway and bridge trust fund reform act".

3 § 2. Paragraph a of subdivision 5 of section 89-b of the state finance 4 law, as amended by section 10 of part C of chapter 57 of the laws of 5 2014, is amended to read as follows:

6 a. Moneys in the dedicated highway and bridge trust fund shall, following appropriation by the legislature, be utilized for: recon-7 8 struction, replacement, reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation and 9 preservation of state, county, town, city and village roads, highways, parkways, and bridges thereon, to restore such facilities to their 10 11 intended functions; construction, reconstruction, enhancement and improvement of state, county, town, city, and village roads, highways, 12 13 parkways, and bridges thereon, to address current and projected capacity 14 problems including costs for traffic mitigation activities; aviation 15 projects authorized pursuant to section fourteen-j of the transportation law and for payments to the general debt service fund of amounts equal 16 17 to amounts required for service contract payments related to aviation projects as provided and authorized by section three hundred eighty-six 18 of the public authorities law; programs to assist small and minority and 19 women-owned firms engaged in transportation construction and recon-20 21 struction projects, including a revolving fund for working capital 22 loans, and a bonding guarantee assistance program in accordance with 23 provisions of this chapter; matching federal grants or apportionments to 24 the state for highway, parkway and bridge capital projects; the acquisi-25 tion of real property and interests therein required or expected to be 26 required in connection with such projects; preventive maintenance activ-27 ities necessary to ensure that highways, parkways and bridges meet or 28 exceed their optimum useful life; [expenses of control of snow and ice

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on state highways by the department of transportation including but not 1 limited to personal services, nonpersonal services and fringe benefits, 2 3 payment of emergency aid for control of snow and ice in municipalities pursuant to section fifty-five of the highway law, expenses of control 4 of snow and ice on state highways by municipalities pursuant to section 5 б twelve of the highway law, and for expenses of arterial maintenance 7 agreements with citics pursuant to section three hundred forty-nine of the highway law; personal services, nonpersonal services, and fringe benefit costs of the department of transportation for bus safety 8 9 inspection activities, rail safety inspection activities, and truck 10 safety inspection activities; costs of the department of motor vehicles, 11 including but not limited to personal and nonpersonal services; ] costs 12 13 engineering and administrative services of the department of transof 14 portation, including but not limited to fringe benefits; the contract 15 services provided by private firms in accordance with section fourteen 16 of the transportation law; personal services and nonpersonal services, 17 for activities including but not limited to the preparation of designs, 18 plans, specifications and estimates; construction management and super-19 vision activities; costs of appraisals, surveys, testing and environ-20 mental impact statements for transportation projects; expenses in 21 connection with buildings, equipment, materials and facilities used or 22 useful in connection with the maintenance, operation, and repair of parkways and bridges thereon; and project costs for: 23 highways, construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and preserva-24 25 tion of rail freight facilities and intercity rail passenger facilities 26 and equipment; construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning 27 and preservation of state, municipal and privately owned ports; construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and preserva-28 29 tion of municipal airports; privately owned airports and aviation capi-30 tal facilities, excluding airports operated by the state or operated by 31 a bi-state municipal corporate instrumentality for which federal funding 32 is not available provided the project is consistent with an approved 33 airport layout plan; and construction, reconstruction, enhancement, improvement, replacement, reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation 34 35 and preservation of state, county, town, city and village roads, high-36 ways, parkways and bridges; and construction, reconstruction, improve-37 ment, reconditioning and preservation of fixed ferry facilities of 38 municipal and privately owned ferry lines for transportation purposes, 39 and the payment of debt service required on any bonds, notes or other obligations and related expenses for highway, parkway, bridge and 40 41 project costs for: construction, reconstruction, improvement, recondi-42 tioning and preservation of rail freight facilities and intercity rail 43 passenger facilities and equipment; construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of state, municipal and 44 45 privately owned ports; construction, reconstruction, improvement, recon-46 ditioning and preservation of municipal airports; privately owned 47 airports and aviation capital facilities, excluding airports operated by the state or operated by a bi-state municipal corporate instrumentality 48 for which federal funding is not available provided the project is 49 50 consistent with an approved airport layout plan; construction, recon-51 struction, enhancement, improvement, replacement, reconditioning, resto-52 ration, rehabilitation and preservation of state, county, town, city and 53 village roads, highways, parkways and bridges; and construction, recon-54 struction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of fixed ferry 55 facilities of municipal and privately owned ferry lines for transporta-56 tion purposes, purposes authorized on or after the effective date of

this section. Beginning with disbursements made on and after the first 1 2 day of April, nineteen hundred ninety-three, moneys in such fund shall 3 be available to pay such costs or expenses made pursuant to appropri-4 ations or reappropriations made during the state fiscal year which began 5 on the first of April, nineteen hundred ninety-two. Beginning the first б day of April, nineteen hundred ninety-three, moneys in such fund shall 7 also be used for transfers to the general debt service fund and the 8 revenue bond tax fund of amounts equal to that respectively required for 9 service contract and financing agreement payments as provided and 10 authorized by section three hundred eighty of the public authorities law, section eleven of chapter three hundred twenty-nine of the laws of 11 12 nineteen hundred ninety-one, as amended, and sections sixty-eight-c and 13 sixty-nine-o of this chapter.

14 § 3. Paragraph a of subdivision 5 of section 89-b of the state finance 15 law, as amended by section 11 of part C of chapter 57 of the laws of 16 2014, is amended to read as follows:

17 a. Moneys in the dedicated highway and bridge trust fund shall, 18 following appropriation by the legislature, be utilized for: recon-19 struction, replacement, reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation and 20 preservation of state, county, town, city and village roads, highways, 21 parkways, and bridges thereon, to restore such facilities to their intended functions; construction, reconstruction, 22 enhancement and improvement of state, county, town, city, and village roads, highways, 23 24 parkways, and bridges thereon, to address current and projected capacity 25 problems including costs for traffic mitigation activities; aviation 26 projects authorized pursuant to section fourteen-j of the transportation 27 law and for payments to the general debt service fund of amounts equal to amounts required for service contract payments related to aviation 28 29 projects as provided and authorized by section three hundred eighty-six 30 of the public authorities law; programs to assist small and minority and 31 women-owned firms engaged in transportation construction and recon-32 struction projects, including a revolving fund for working capital loans, and a bonding guarantee assistance program in accordance with 33 34 provisions of this chapter; matching federal grants or apportionments to 35 the state for highway, parkway and bridge capital projects; the acquisi-36 tion of real property and interests therein required or expected to be 37 required in connection with such projects; preventive maintenance activ-38 ities necessary to ensure that highways, parkways and bridges meet or exceed their optimum useful life; [expenses of control of snow and ice 39 40 on state highways by the department of transportation including but not 41 limited to personal services, nonpersonal services and fringe benefits, payment of emergency aid for control of gnow and ice in municipalities 42 pursuant to section fifty-five of the highway law, expenses of control 43 44 of snow and ice on state highways by municipalities pursuant to section 45 twelve of the highway law, and for expenses of arterial maintenance 46 agreements with citics pursuant to section three hundred forty-nine of 47 the highway law; personal services, nonpersonal services, and fringe benefit costs of the department of transportation for bus safety inspection activities, rail safety inspection activities, and truck 48 49 **safety inspection activities**] costs of engineering and administrative 50 51 services of the department of transportation, including but not limited 52 to fringe benefits; the contract services provided by private firms in 53 accordance with section fourteen of the transportation law; personal 54 services and nonpersonal services, for activities including but not limited to the preparation of designs, plans, specifications and esti-55 56 mates; construction management and supervision activities; costs of

appraisals, surveys, testing and environmental impact statements for 1 2 transportation projects; expenses in connection with buildings, equipment, materials and facilities used or useful in connection with the 3 4 maintenance, operation, and repair of highways, parkways and bridges 5 thereon; and project costs for: construction, reconstruction, improveб ment, reconditioning and preservation of rail freight facilities and 7 intercity rail passenger facilities and equipment; construction, recon-8 struction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of state, munic-9 ipal and privately owned ports; construction, reconstruction, improve-10 ment, reconditioning and preservation of municipal airports; privately 11 owned airports and aviation capital facilities, excluding airports operated by the state or operated by a bi-state municipal corporate instru-12 13 mentality for which federal funding is not available provided the 14 project is consistent with an approved airport layout plan; and 15 construction, reconstruction, enhancement, improvement, replacement, 16 reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation and preservation of state, 17 county, town, city and village roads, highways, parkways and bridges; and construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and pres-18 19 ervation of fixed ferry facilities of municipal and privately owned 20 ferry lines for transportation purposes, and the payment of debt service 21 required on any bonds, notes or other obligations and related expenses for highway, parkway, bridge and project costs for: construction, recon-22 struction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of rail freight 23 24 facilities and intercity rail passenger facilities and equipment; 25 construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and preserva-26 tion of state, municipal and privately owned ports; construction, recon-27 struction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of municipal airports; privately owned airports and aviation capital facilities, 28 29 excluding airports operated by the state or operated by a bi-state 30 municipal corporate instrumentality for which federal funding is not 31 available provided the project is consistent with an approved airport 32 layout plan; construction, reconstruction, enhancement, improvement, 33 replacement, reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation and preserva-34 tion of state, county, town, city and village roads, highways, parkways 35 and bridges; and construction, reconstruction, improvement, recondition-36 ing and preservation of fixed ferry facilities of municipal and private-37 ly owned ferry lines for transportation purposes, purposes authorized on 38 or after the effective date of this section. Beginning with disbursements made on and after the first day of April, nineteen hundred nine-39 ty-three, moneys in such fund shall be available to pay such costs or 40 41 expenses made pursuant to appropriations or reappropriations made during 42 the state fiscal year which began on the first of April, nineteen 43 hundred ninety-two. Beginning the first day of April, nineteen hundred ninety-three, moneys in such fund shall also be used for transfers to 44 45 general debt service fund and the revenue bond tax fund of amounts the 46 equal to that respectively required for service contract and financing 47 agreement payments as provided and authorized by section three hundred eighty of the public authorities law, section eleven of chapter 48 three 49 hundred twenty-nine of the laws of nineteen hundred ninety-one, as 50 amended, and sections sixty-eight-c and sixty-nine-o of this chapter. 51 § 4. This act shall take effect immediately, provided, however, that 52 the amendments to paragraph a of subdivision 5 of section 89-b of the 53 state finance law made by section two of this act shall be subject to 54 the expiration and reversion of such paragraph pursuant to section 2 of 55 part B of chapter 84 of the laws of 2002, as amended, when upon such 56 date the provisions of section three of this act shall take effect.
