AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to requiring the department of health of the state of New York to conduct a study of the effects of racial and ethnic disparities on infant mortality and prepare and submit a report to the governor and the legislature

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 2 2500-1 to read as follows:
- § 2500-1. Study of the effects of racial and ethnic disparities on infant mortality. 1. The department shall conduct a study on the feffects of racial and ethnic disparities on infant mortality. The purpose of the study shall be to:
- 7 (a) identify statewide and regional infant death rates, trends,
 8 patterns, and racial and ethnic disparities in adverse birth outcomes,
 9 and medical, non-medical, and system-related factors that may have
 10 contributed to infant deaths and treatment disparities;
- 11 (b) review the extent to which racial and ethnic disparities in infant
 12 mortality in a geographic area indicate the need to increase access to
 13 health care services among racial and ethnic populations in that area;
 14 and
- 15 <u>(c) identify ways to reduce or eliminate racial and ethnic disparities</u> 16 <u>that contribute to infant mortality.</u>
- 2. In conducting the study, the department may seek the advice of persons specializing in the fields of neonatal and post neonatal pathology, maternal and infant health, minority health advocacy, or other related fields.
- 3. Within one year after the effective date of this section, the department shall prepare and submit to the governor, the temporary president of the senate, the speaker of the assembly, the minority leader of

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the senate and the minority leader of the assembly a report containing the study's findings concerning the effects of racial and ethnic disparities on infant mortality and recommendations for legislative or other 3 actions that can be undertaken to:

- (a) reduce infant mortality and improve birth outcomes in the state;
- (b) reduce or eliminate racial and ethnic disparities that contribute to infant mortality; and
- 8 (c) increase access to health care services among racial and ethnic 9 populations in the state.
- 4. The department may prepare and submit additional reports when the department deems it appropriate, and each report, with the exception of the first report prepared under this section, shall additionally identify the extent to which the department's prior recommendations have been 14 successfully implemented in practice and the apparent impact that the implementation of such recommended changes has had on infant mortality in the preceding years.
- \S 2. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall have become a law. Effective immediately the addition, amendment and/or 17 18 repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of 19 20 this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed on or before such date.
