Introduced by M. of A. FERNANDEZ -- read once and referred to the Committee on Election Law

AN ACT to amend the election law, the town law and the education law, in relation to the right to vote for an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 5-102 of the election law is amended to read as follows: 2

- 1. No person shall be qualified to register for and vote at any 4 election unless he or she is a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States and is or will be, on the day of such election, eighteen years of age or over, and a resident of this state and of the county, city or village for a minimum of thirty days next preceding such election.
- § 2. Paragraph (g) of subdivision 5 of section 5-210 of the election 10 law, as amended by chapter 2 of the laws of 2019, is amended to read as follows: 11

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- (g) Notice that the applicant must be a citizen of the United States, 13 or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States, is at least sixteen years old when he or she submits an application to register to vote which will be effective for elections occurring on or after the applicant turns eighteen years of age and a resident of 16 the county or city to which application is made.
- 18 § 3. Subdivision 8 of section 7-122 of the election law, as amended by chapter 165 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows: 19
- 20 8. On the reverse side of such inner affirmation envelope shall be 21 printed the following statement:

I do declare that I am a citizen of the United States, or an alien 24 lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States, that I

- § 4. Subdivision 3 of section 7-123 of the election law, as amended by 21 22 chapter 104 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:
- 23 3. The board of elections shall furnish an inner affirmation envelope with each military ballot upon which envelope shall be printed:

25 BALLOT FOR MILITARY VOTER 26 AFFIRMATION

27 I swear or affirm that:

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- (a) I am a member of the uniformed services or merchant marine on active duty or an eligible spouse, parent, child or dependent of such a member, and
- (b) I am a United States citizen, or an alien lawfully admitted for 32 permanent residence in the United States, at least eighteen years of age (or will be by the day of the election), eligible to vote in the requested jurisdiction, and
 - (c) I have neither been convicted of a felony or other disqualifying offense nor been adjudicated mentally incompetent, or if so, my voting rights have been reinstated, and
 - (d) I am not registering, requesting a ballot, or voting in any other jurisdiction in the United States, and
- 40 (e) My signature and date below indicate when I completed this docu-41 ment, and
- 42 (f) The information on this form is true and complete to the best of 43 my knowledge.
- I understand that a material misstatement of fact in the completion of 44 45 this document may constitute grounds for conviction of a crime.

- § 5. Subdivision 3 of section 8-504 of the election law, as renumbered by chapter 373 of the laws of 1978, is amended to read as follows:
- 3. After receiving the answers as above specified, of any applicant, the board shall, if it believes the applicant to be qualified or the challenge is withdrawn, permit him or her to vote. Otherwise, the board 10 shall point out to him or her the qualifications, if any, in respect of 11 which he or she shall appear deficient. If, after such deficiencies have 12 13 been so indicated, the applicant shall persist in his or her claim to 14 vote, an inspector shall administer to him or her the following oath, which shall be known as "The Qualification Oath": "You do swear (or affirm) that you are eighteen years of age, that you are a citizen of 16 the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States and that you have been a resident of this state, 19 and of this county (of the city of New York) (village) for thirty days 20 next preceding this election, that you still reside at the same address from which you have been duly registered in this election district, that 21 you have not voted at this election, and that you do not know of any 22 23 reason why you are not qualified to vote at this election. You do further declare that you are aware that it is a crime to make any false 24 25 statement. That all the statements you have made to the board have been true and that you understand that a false statement is perjury and you 27 will be guilty of a misdemeanor."
 - § 6. Paragraph b of subdivision 5 of section 84-a of the town law, amended by section 10 of part LL of chapter 56 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:
 - b. On the reverse side of such envelope shall be printed the following statement:

STATEMENT OF ABSENTEE VOTER

I do declare that I will have been a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States for thirty days, and will be at least eighteen years of age, on the date of the special town election; that I will have been a resident of this state and of the town shown on the reverse side of this envelope for thirty days next preceding the said election; that I am or on such date will be, a registered voter of said town; that I will be unable to appear personally on the day of said special town election at the polling place of the election district in which I am or will be a qualified voter because of the reason stated on my application heretofore submitted; that I have not qualified, or do I intend to vote, elsewhere than as set forth on the reverse side of this envelope; that I have not received or offered, do not expect to receive, have not paid, offered or promised to pay, contributed, offered or promised to contribute to another to be paid or used, any money or other valuable thing, as a compensation or reward for the giving or withholding of a vote at this special town election, and have not made any promise to influence the giving or withholding of any such votes; that I have not made or become directly or indirectly interested in any bet or wager depending upon the 53 result of this special town election; and that I have not been convicted 54 of bribery or any infamous crime, or, if so convicted, that I have been 55 pardoned or restored to all the rights of a citizen, without restriction

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1 as to the right of suffrage, or received a certificate of relief from disabilities or a certificate of good conduct pursuant to article twenty-three of the correction law removing my disability to register and vote.

- § 7. Paragraph a of subdivision 2 of section 213-b of the town law, as added by chapter 400 of the laws of 1985, is amended to read as follows: a. An applicant for such an absentee ballot shall submit an application setting forth (1) his or her name and residence address, including the street and number, if any, or town and rural delivery route, if any; (2) that he or she is or will be, on the day of the election, a qualified voter of the district in which he or she resides in that he or she is or will be, on such date, over eighteen years of age, a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States and has or will have resided in the district for thirty days next preceding such date; (3) that he or she is registered in the town; (4) that he or she will be unable to appear to vote in person on the day of the election for which the absentee ballot is requested because he or she is, or will be on such day (a) a patient in a hospital, or unable to appear personally at the polling place on such day because of illness or physical disability or (b) because his or her duties, occupation or business will require him or her to be outside of the county or city of his or her residence on such day, (c) because he or she will be on vacation outside the county or city of his or her residence on such day; or, (d) absent from his or her voting residence 30 because he or she is detained in jail awaiting action by a grand jury or awaiting trial or is confined in prison after conviction for an offense other than a felony. Such application must be received by the district secretary at least seven days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter or his or her agent.
 - § 8. Paragraph b of subdivision 5 of section 213-b of the town law, as amended by section 12 of part LL of chapter 56 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:
- 39 b. On the reverse side of such envelope shall be printed the follow-40 ing statement:

I hereby declare that the foregoing is a true statement to the best of my knowledge and belief, and I understand that if I make any material false statement in the foregoing statement of absentee voter, I shall be quilty of a misdemeanor.

- 1. A citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States.
- § 10. Paragraph a of subdivision 2 of section 2018-a of the education law, as amended by chapter 136 of the laws of 1991, is amended to read 24 as follows:
- 25 a. An applicant for such an absentee ballot shall submit an application setting forth (1) his or her name and residence address, including 27 the street and number, if any, or town and rural delivery route, if any; (2) that he or she is or will be, on the day of the school district 28 29 election, a qualified voter of the school district in which he or she 30 resides in that he or she is or will be, on such date, over eighteen 31 years of age, a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States and has or will have resided in the district for thirty days next preceding such date; (3) 33 34 whether he or she is registered in the district; (4) that he or she will 35 be unable to appear to vote in person on the day of the school district election for which the absentee ballot is requested because he or she 36 is, or will be on such day (a) a patient in a hospital, or unable to 37 appear personally at the polling place on such day because of illness or 38 physical disability or (b) because his or her duties, occupation, busi-39 ness, or studies will require him or her to be outside of the county or 40 41 city of his or her residence on such day, (c) because he or she will be on vacation outside the county or city of his or her residence on such 43 day; or, (d) absent from his or her voting residence because he or she 44 is detained in jail awaiting action by a grand jury or awaiting trial or 45 is confined in prison after conviction for an offense other than a felo-46 ny. 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I do declare that I am a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States, and will be at least eighteen years of age, on the date of the school district 3 election; that I will have been a resident of this state and of the school district and school election district, if any, shown on the reverse side of this envelope for thirty days next preceding the said 7 election and duly registered in the school district and school election district, if any, shown on the reverse side of this envelope and that I 9 am or on such date will be, a qualified voter of said school district; 10 that I will be unable to appear personally on the day of said school 11 district election at the polling place of the said district in which I am or will be a qualified voter because of the reason stated on my 12 application heretofore submitted; that I have not qualified, or do I 13 14 intend to vote, elsewhere than as set forth on the reverse side of this 15 envelope; that I have not received or offered, do not expect to receive, 16 have not paid, offered or promised to pay, contributed, offered or prom-17 ised to contribute to another to be paid or used, any money or other valuable thing, as a compensation or reward for the giving or withhold-18 ing of a vote at this school district election, and have not made any 19 20 promise to influence the giving or withholding of any such votes; that I have not made or become directly or indirectly interested in any bet or wager depending upon the result of this school district election; and 22 that I have not been convicted of bribery or any infamous crime, or, 23 24 so convicted, that I have been pardoned or restored to all the rights of a citizen, without restriction as to the right of suffrage, or received 25 26 a certificate of relief from disabilities or a certificate of good 27 conduct pursuant to article twenty-three of the correction law removing 28 my disability to register and vote.

34 § 12. Paragraph a of subdivision 2 of section 2018-b of the education 35 law, as amended by chapter 46 of the laws of 1992, is amended to read as 36 follows:

37 a. An applicant for such an absentee ballot shall submit an applica-38 tion setting forth (1) his or her name and residence address, including 39 the street and number, if any, or town and rural delivery route, if any; 40 (2) that he or she is or will be, on the day of the school district election, a qualified voter of the school district in which he or she 41 resides in that he or she is or will be, on such date, over eighteen 42 43 years of age, a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admit-44 ted for permanent residence in the United States and has or will have 45 resided in the district for thirty days next preceding such date; (3) that he or she will be unable to appear to vote in person on the day of 46 the school district election for which the absentee ballot is requested 47 48 because he or she is, or will be on such day (a) a patient in a hospi-49 tal, or unable to appear personally at the polling place on such day 50 because of illness or physical disability or (b) because his or her duties, occupation, business, or studies will require him or her to be 52 outside of the county or city of his or her residence on such day, (c) 53 because he or she will be on vacation outside the county or city of his or her residence on such day; or, (d) absent from his or her voting

- § 13. Paragraph b of subdivision 6 of section 2018-b of the education law, as amended by section 9 of part LL of chapter 56 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 b. On the reverse side of such envelope shall be printed the following 12 statement:

14 I do declare that I am a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States, and will 15 be at least eighteen years of age on the date of the school district 16 election; that I will have been a resident of this state and of the 17 18 school district and school election district, if any, shown on the 19 reverse side of this envelope for thirty days next preceding the said 20 election and that I am or on such date will be, a qualified voter of said school district; that I will be unable to appear personally on the 21 day of said school district election at the polling place of the said 22 district in which I am or will be a qualified voter because of the 23 24 reason stated on my application heretofore submitted; that I have not 25 qualified, or do I intend to vote, elsewhere than as set forth on the reverse side of this envelope; that I have not received or offered, do 26 not expect to receive, have not paid, offered or promised to pay, 27 28 contributed, offered or promised to contribute to another to be paid or 29 used, any money or other valuable thing, as a compensation or reward for 30 the giving or withholding of a vote at this school district election, 31 and have not made any promise to influence the giving or withholding of any such votes; that I have not made or become directly or indirectly 33 interested in any bet or wager depending upon the result of this school district election; and that I have not been convicted of bribery or any infamous crime, or, if so convicted, that I have been pardoned or 36 restored to all the rights of a citizen, without restriction as to the 37 right of suffrage, or have received a certificate of relief from disabilities or a certificate of good conduct pursuant to article twenty-38 three of the correction law removing my disability to vote. 39

- § 14. Subdivision 1 of section 2603 of the education law, as amended by chapter 182 of the laws of 1952, is amended to read as follows:
- 1. A citizen of the United States <u>or an alien lawfully admitted for</u>
 48 <u>permanent residence in the United States</u>.
- § 15. Subdivision 5 of section 2609 of the education law, as amended by chapter 919 of the laws of 1974, is amended to read as follows:
- 51 5. Any qualified voter of a city school district may challenge the 52 right of a person to vote at the time when he <u>or she</u> requests a ballot.

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1 All persons named upon the applicable register as having been challenged prior to the day of the election shall also be challenged before they are given ballots to vote. The chairman of the board of inspectors shall administer to each person so challenged the following oath: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I am a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States; 7 that I am of the age of eighteen years or more; that I have been an inhabitant of the State for the past year, a resident of the county for 9 the past four months and for the thirty days past an actual resident of 10 this city school district and am therefore qualified to vote at this 11 election." If the person challenged so swears or affirms, he or she shall be permitted to vote at such election; but if he or she shall 12 13 refuse to so swear or affirm, he or she shall not be given a ballot or 14 be permitted to vote. 15

§ 16. This act shall take effect on the first of January next succeed-16 ing the date on which it shall have become a law; provided however that the amendments to section 5-210 of the election law made by section two 18 of this act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as 19 chapter 2 of the laws of 2019, takes effect.
