AN ACT to amend the real property actions and proceedings law and the real property tax law, in relation to requiring the court in a fore-closure action to provide notice to the former owner of the real property of the right to apply for surplus moneys from the sale of such property

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Section 1354 of the real property actions and proceedings law is amended by adding a new subdivision 5 to read as follows:
- 5. The court shall provide notice to the former owner or owners of the foreclosed real property of the existence of surplus moneys resulting from the sale and their right to file a written notice of claim to all or a portion of such proceeds pursuant to section thirteen hundred sixty-one of this article.
- 8 § 2. Section 1136 of the real property tax law is amended by adding a new subdivision 4 to read as follows:

 10 4. Notice to former owners. In the event the court directs the sale of
