AN ACT to amend the public authorities law, in relation to making municipal housing authorities subject to the review and regulation of the authorities budget office; and to repeal section 7 of chapter 913 of the laws of 1957 amending the public housing law relating to incorporating certain provisions of the public authorities law therein, relating to exempting municipal housing authorities from the public authorities law

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 2 of the public authorities law, 2 as amended by chapter 257 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as 3 follows:
- 2. "local authority" shall mean (a) a public authority or public benefit corporation created by or existing under this chapter or any other
  law of the state of New York whose members do not hold a civil office of
  the state, are not appointed by the governor or are appointed by the
  governor specifically upon the recommendation of the local government or
  governments; (b) a not-for-profit corporation affiliated with, sponsored
  by, or created by a county, city, town or village government; (c) a
  local industrial developmental agency or authority or other local public
  benefit corporation; (d) an affiliate of such local authority; [er] (e)
  a land bank corporation created pursuant to article sixteen of the notfor-profit corporation law; or (f) any municipal housing authority
- 16 § 2. Section 7 of chapter 913 of the laws of 1957 amending the public 17 housing law relating to incorporating certain provisions of the public 18 authorities law therein is REPEALED.
