AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to silent meditation in public schools

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 3029-a of the education law, as added by chapter 1204 of the laws of 1971, is amended to read as follows:

§ 3029-a. Silent meditation in public schools. 1. In each public school classroom, the teacher [~~in charge may, or if so authorized or directed by the board of education by which he is employed,~~] shall, at the opening of school upon every school day, [~~conduct~~] observe a [~~brief~~] one minute period of silent meditation with the participation of all the pupils therein assembled.

2. The silent meditation authorized by [~~subsection~~] subdivision one of this [~~act~~] section is not intended to be, and shall not be conducted as, a religious service or exercise, but may be considered as an opportunity for silent meditation on a religious theme by those who are so disposed, or a moment of silent reflection on the anticipated activities of the day. As used in subdivision one of this section the term "participation" shall be construed to permit seated participation and not to require any pupil to stand.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
