AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to allowing brewery supply stores to sell beer for off premises consumption

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 3 of the alcoholic beverage control law is amended by adding a new subdivision 4-a to read as follows:

4-a. "Brewery supply store" means and includes any place or premises where ingredients and equipment to make beer, wine and cider in the home are sold. A brewery supply store may be on the same premises as a brewery.

§ 2. Subdivision 4 of section 54 of the alcoholic beverage control law, as amended by chapter 503 of the laws of 1954, is amended to read as follows:

4. No such license shall be issued, however, to any person for any premises other than a grocery store, drug store, brewery supply store, or duly licensed supply ship operating in harbors in Lake Erie.

§ 3. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall have become a law.
