AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to applications for licenses; and to repeal certain provisions of such law relating thereto

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by chapter 37 of the laws of 2019, is amended to read as follows:

3 1. Application for license. Application for a driver's license shall 4 be made to the commissioner. The fee prescribed by law may be submitted with such application. The applicant shall furnish such proof of identi-7 ty, age, and fitness as may be required by the commissioner. With respect to a non-commercial driver's license or learner's permit which does not meet federal standards for identification, in addition to the 10 acceptable proofs of age and identity approved by the commissioner as of 11 January first, two thousand nineteen, acceptable proof of identity shall 12 also include, but not be limited to, a valid, unexpired foreign passport 13 issued by the applicant's country of citizenship (which shall also be 14 eligible as proof of age), a valid, unexpired consular identification 15 document issued by a consulate from the applicant's country of citizen-16 ship, or a valid foreign driver's license that includes a photo image of 17 the applicant and which is unexpired or expired for less than twenty-18 four months of its date of expiration, as primary forms of such proof. Nothing contained in this subdivision shall be deemed to preclude the 19 commissioner from approving additional proofs of identity and age. 21 commissioner may also provide that the application procedure shall include the taking of a photo image or images of the applicant in 23 accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the commissioner. In 24 addition, the commissioner also shall require that the applicant provide 25 his or her social security number or, in lieu thereof, with respect to an application for a non-commercial driver's license or learner's permit 27 which does not meet federal standards for identification, an affidavit

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signed by such applicant that they have not been issued a social security number. The commissioner also shall provide <u>space on the application</u> so that the applicant may request a notation upon such license that he or she is a veteran of the United States armed forces, and space on the application so that the applicant may register in the New York state organ and tissue donor registry under section forty-three hundred ten of the public health law with the following stated on the application in clear and conspicuous type:

9 "You must fill out the following section: Would you like to be added 10 to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this ques11 tion'."

The commissioner of health shall not maintain records of any person 12 who checks "skip this question". Except where the application is made in 13 14 person or electronically, failure to check a box shall not impair the validity of an application, and failure to check "yes" or checking "skip 15 16 this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In the case of an applicant under eighteen years of age, checking "yes" 17 18 shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration in the donate life registry, except as otherwise provided pursuant to 19 20 the provisions of paragraph (b) of subdivision one of section fortythree hundred one of the public health law. Where an applicant has previously consented to make an anatomical gift or registered in the 22 donate life registry, checking "skip this question" or failing to check 23 a box shall not impair that consent or registration. In addition, 24 25 applicant for a commercial driver's license who will operate a commercial motor vehicle in interstate commerce shall certify that such appli-27 cant meets the requirements to operate a commercial motor vehicle, as set forth in public law 99-570, title XII, and title 49 of the code of 28 federal regulations, and all regulations promulgated by the United 29 30 States secretary of transportation under the hazardous materials trans-31 portation act. In addition, an applicant for a commercial driver's license shall submit a medical certificate at such intervals as required 33 by the federal motor carrier safety improvement act of 1999 and Part 383.71(h) of title 49 of the code of federal regulations relating to 34 35 medical certification and in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. 36 For purposes of this section and sections five hundred three, five hundred ten-a, and five hundred ten-aa of this title, the terms "medical certificate" and "medical certification" shall mean a form substantially 38 39 in compliance with the form set forth in Part 391.43(h) of title 49 of the code of federal regulations. Upon a determination that the holder of 40 41 a commercial driver's license has made any false statement, with respect 42 to the application for such license, the commissioner shall revoke such 43 license.

- § 2. Subdivision 1 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by chapter 487 of the laws of 2012, is REPEALED.
  - § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
