**WHEREAS,** The Very Reverend J. Mastine Nisbett is the author of the book, **A Journey to the Promised Land, The Struggle of a Suburban Church to Build an Edifice**, which was published in 2011; and

**WHEREAS,** Prior to leading St. David's Episcopal Church, The Very Reverend J. Mastine Nisbett served as Rector of St. George's Church in Antigua; and

**WHEREAS,** J. Mastine Nisbett graduated from University of the West Indies in 1975, with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Theology; he went on to earn a Master of Arts degree in Religious Education/Pastoral Counseling from Fordham University in 1989, before receiving his Doctor of Ministry degree from University of the South in 2004; and

**WHEREAS,** The Very Reverend J. Mastine Nisbett has brought to his ministry an overwhelming spirit of charity and compassion, acting from vision and enlightenment in conducting his administrative and spiritual duties, while always displaying the highest standards of personal and professional integrity and dedication; and

**WHEREAS,** This distinguished man of God has always given enlightenment, guidance and wisdom to the many entrusted to his care and has administered abundantly and unstintingly to the spiritual and corporal needs of all; and
