WHEREAS, The book is the true story of author Raymond F. O'Conor's mother, Helen Gregg, the daughter of Irish immigrant parents raised in the miseries of New York's Hell's Kitchen during the Great Depression, and her husband, Raymond Stephenson, an aspiring World War II B-17 pilot from the struggling city of Ironton, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, They share a brief yet extraordinary life together, until the war tears them apart and he is killed in a flying accident; and

WHEREAS, The screenplay's title, Foreverly, was inspired by Jeff Brisbin, a composer, lyricist and performer who wrote a ballad bearing the same title; and

WHEREAS, Today, Raymond F. O'Conor holds the title of Chairman of Saratoga National Bank & Trust Company; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that when artistic creators of such remarkable talent and accomplishments are brought to our attention, they should be celebrated and recognized by all the

citizens of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it
