WHEREAS, Chinese American helped completed the Transcontinental Railroad and 1 in 5 Chinese Americans enlisted to serve in World War II; and

WHEREAS, The State of New York is home to a thriving overseas ethnic Chinese communities that support the People's Republic of China, including the America Chinese Development Center, Asian American Community Empowerment, American Chinese Commerce Association, that devoted themselves to the harmony and development of the community of the State of New York, now, therefore, be it
