WHEREAS, Audrey Rose Harlow's commitment to excellence, and her spirit of humanity, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charitable and civic endeavors; she was a member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Mount Kisco, New York, before becoming a member of the Congregation at Duke University Chapel where she participated in the Local Missions' Committee and the Staff-Parish Relations Committee; and

WHEREAS, Predeceased by her first husband, Douglas, Audrey Rose Harlow is survived by her husband, Ed; her two children, James and Carolyn; and six grandchildren, David, Beth, Ellen, Katelyn, Ethan and Aaron; and
