AN ACT to amend chapter 474 of the laws of 1996, amending the education law and other laws relating to rates for residential healthcare facilities, in relation to directing the department of health to make additional payments for inpatient services to certain public general hospitals

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 1 of section 212 of chapter 2 474 of the laws of 1996, amending the education law and other laws 3 relating to rates for residential healthcare facilities, as amended by 4 section 1 of part D of chapter 59 of the laws of 2016, is amended to 5 read as follows:

The 43 payments may be added to rates of payment or made as aggregate payments 44 to an eligible public general hospital.
