AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to burglary in the second degree

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 140.25 of the penal law, as amended by chapter 361 of the laws of 1981, is amended and a new subdivision 3 is added to read as follows:

2. The building is a dwelling[-]; or

- 3. The building is a dwelling which, at the time of the commission of the crime, is occupied by a person who is not a participant in the crime.
