AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to requiring pharmacies to make reasonable attempts to notify patients of certain drug recalls

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section 6811-c to read as follows:

- § 6811-c. Patient notification of recalled drugs. 1. For purposes of this section the term "class I recall" shall mean a situation in which the United States food and drug administration deems there is reasonable probability that the use of or exposure to a violative product will cause serious adverse health consequences or death.
- 2. Where there has been a class I recall of a prescription drug, pharmacies shall make a reasonable attempt to notify all patients that have
  been prescribed and who are currently taking such recalled drug
  dispensed from such pharmacy by phone or by mail within three days of
  the pharmacy being notified by the United States food and drug administration, a manufacturer, a wholesaler or by other notice of such recall.
- 3. The notification required by this section may be provided by an individual pharmacy or by a central office in the case of a pharmacy that is part of a chain.
