CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY

proposing an amendment to article 1 of the constitution, in relation to equality of rights and protection against discrimination

Section 1. Resolved (if the Assembly concur), That article 1 of the constitution be amended by adding a new section 19 to read as follows:

§ 19. (a) No person shall be denied equal rights under the laws of this state or any subdivision thereof based on that person's race, color, ethnicity, national origin, disability, or sex including pregnancy and pregnancy outcomes, sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.

(b) No government entity, nor any entity acting in concert with or on behalf of the government, nor any entity in its provision of public accommodations, employment, or personnel practices shall discriminate against any person in either intent or effect based on the characteristics listed in subdivision (a) of this section.

(c) No government entity, nor any entity acting in concert with or on behalf of the government, nor any entity in the provision of public accommodations, employment, or personnel practices shall discriminate against any person based on that person's religion. In interpreting this section, the courts shall analyze claims of religious discrimination

3 (d) Nothing in this section shall invalidate or prevent the adoption
4 of any law, regulation, program, or practice that is designed to remedy

7 (e) This section shall be self-executing. The legislature may expand
8 upon the entitlement to equal rights and freedom from discrimination
9 hereby secured.

10 § 2. Resolved (if the Assembly concur), That the foregoing amendment
11 be referred to the first regular legislative session convening after the
12 next succeeding general election of members of the assembly, and, in
13 conformity with section 1 of article 19 of the constitution, be
14 published for three months previous to the time of such election.
