CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY

proposing an amendment to section 2 of article 3 of the constitution, in relation to increasing the length of the term of office and imposing term limits for members of the legislature

Section 1. Resolved (if the Assembly concur), That section 2 of article 3 of the constitution be amended to read as follows:

§ 2. The senate shall consist of fifty members, except as hereinafter 3 4 provided. The senators [elected in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five shall hold their offices for three years, and their 5 б **successors**] shall be [chosen] elected for terms of two years; provided, 7 that senators elected in the year two thousand twenty and in subsequent 8 years shall hold their offices for four years. The assembly shall consist of one hundred and fifty members. The assembly members [elected 9 10 in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and their successors,] shall be [chosen] elected for terms of two years; provided, 11 12 that assembly members elected in the year two thousand twenty and in 13 subsequent years shall hold their offices for four years.

14 No person elected to office in the senate in the year two thousand 15 twenty and in subsequent years shall serve as a member of the senate for more than three consecutive four year terms. No person elected to office 16 in the assembly in the year two thousand twenty and in subsequent years 17 shall serve as a member of the assembly for more than three consecutive 18 19 four year terms. Any partial term of office held as a member of the 20 legislature prior to the election to a consecutive four year term shall not be used to calculate any term limitation imposed pursuant to this 21 22 paragraph.

§ 2. Resolved (if the Assembly concur), That the foregoing amendments be referred to the first regular legislative session convening after the next succeeding general election of members of the assembly, and, in conformity with section 1 of article 19 of the constitution, be published three months previous to the time of such election.
