AN ACT to amend the correction law, in relation to a reading proficiency level assessment and dyslexia screening for incarcerated individuals

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The correction law is amended by adding a new section 137-a 2 to read as follows:

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- § 137-a. Reading proficiency level assessment and dyslexia screening. 4 1. As part of the intake process, an incarcerated individual who does 5 not have a high school diploma or its equivalent shall receive a reading proficiency level assessment and dyslexia screening. If an incarcerated individual demonstrates that he or she is below the proficiency level required to be a high-functioning reader, such individual shall be provided with dyslexia intervention that is evidence-based, effective, and consistent with science-based research specifically tailored to 10 11 addressing dyslexia.
- 2. The commissioner, in consultation with the commissioner of educa-12 13 tion, shall promulgate rules and regulations that require, but are not <u>limited</u> to the following: 14
- 15 (a) Teachers at all correctional facilities shall have and demonstrate 16 awareness of the best practices of scientific reading instruction;
- 17 (b) Each inmate who does not have a high school diploma or its equivalent shall receive a reading proficiency level assessment and a dysle-18 19 xia screening; and
- (c) A process be established in which incarcerated individuals, upon 20 21 intake, are assessed and administered a dyslexia screening, and provided 22 with dyslexia intervention that is evidence-based, effective, and consistent with science-based research specifically tailored to address-24 ing dyslexia.

EXPLANATION -- Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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3. Each superintendent shall submit a plan to the department that
allows incarcerated individuals to voluntarily receive a reading proficiency level assessment, dyslexia screening, and reading instruction
that is evidence-based, effective, and consistent with science-based
research specifically tailored to addressing dyslexia.

§ 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall have become a law. Effective immediately the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed on or before such date.
