AN ACT to amend a chapter of the laws of 2019, relating to directing the study of the future implementation of fifth and future generation wireless network system technology in the state, in relation to the agencies which shall conduct such study

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Sections 1, 2 and 3 of a chapter of the laws of 2019, relating to directing the study of the future implementation of fifth and future generation wireless network system technology in the state, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 1607 and A. 1503, are amended to read as follows:

Section 1. The office of information technology services, the department of public service, the urban development corporation, the division of homeland security and emergency services, the division of state police and the division of military and naval affairs shall study and evaluate the implementation of fifth generation (5G) and future generation wireless systems technology in the state.

- § 2. No later than one year after the effective date of this act, [the office of information technology services] such agencies shall submit to the governor and the legislature a report on 5G technology, as described under section one of this act.
- 16 § 3. [The office of information technology services] Such agencies 17 shall evaluate such data with the assistance of experts in:
 - a. wireless technology;
 - b. network capacity;
- 20 c. cyber security; and
- d. internet speed.

§ 2.
