AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to authorizing the use of opioid antagonists by persons or entities for opioid overdose prevention

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (a) of subdivision 3 of 2 section 3309 of the public health law, as amended by chapter 68 of the 3 laws of 2016, is amended and a new subparagraph (v) is added to read as 4 follows:

(iv) "Opioid antagonist recipient" or "recipient" means a person at 6 risk of experiencing an opioid-related overdose, or a family member, friend or other person in a position to assist a person experiencing or at risk of experiencing an opioid-related overdose, or an organization registered as an opioid overdose prevention program pursuant to this section or [a school district, public library, board of cooperative 10 11 educational services, county vocational education and extension board, charter school, non-public elementary and/or secondary school in this 12 13 **state**] **any person or entity** or any person employed by [such district, 14 library board or school the person or entity.

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- (v) As used in this section, "entity" includes, but is not limited to, 16 <u>a school district, public library, board of cooperative educational</u> 17 <u>services, county vocational education and extension board, charter</u> 18 school, non-public elementary or secondary school, restaurant, bar, retail store, shopping mall, barber shop, beauty parlor, theater, sporting or event center, inn, hotel or motel.
- 21 § 2. Subdivision 4 of section 3309 of the public health law, as 22 amended by chapter 68 of the laws of 2016, is amended to read as 23 follows:
- 24 4. (a) Use of an opioid antagonist pursuant to this section shall be 25 considered first aid or emergency treatment for the purpose of any stat-26 ute relating to liability.

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(b) A recipient, opioid overdose prevention program, [school district, 2 public library, board of cooperative educational services, county vocational education and extension board, charter school, non-public elementary school and/or secondary school in the state] person or entity, or 5 any person employed by [such district, public library, board or school 6 under this section the person or entity, acting reasonably and in good faith in compliance with this section, shall not be subject to criminal, civil or administrative liability solely by reason of such action. § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
