AN ACT in relation to determining whether the state can claim federal financial participation for coverage of and payment for certain prescription digital therapeutics

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Legislative finding and declaration. New Yorkers in recovery for substance and opioid use disorders and in treatment for mental
2 health conditions are losing access to in-person treatment under the
3 state's "stay at home" and social distancing orders as part of coronavirus pandemic mitigation efforts. In recent news reports, experts warn
4 that the coronavirus pandemic may be "a national relapse trigger" for
5 individuals in treatment for alcohol, cocaine, methamphetamine, marijuana,
6 and heroin addiction. Prescription Digital Therapeutics (PDTs) are
7 new, software-based disease treatments designed to directly treat
8 disease, tested for safety and efficacy in randomized clinical trials,
9 evaluated by the FDA, and prescribed by healthcare providers. These
10 therapies are designed and tested much like traditional prescription
11 drugs with one distinction: rather than swallowing a pill or taking an
12 injection, patients are treated with software. Certain PDTs provide
13 clinicians and patients with evidence-based remote treatment modalities
14 to treat substance and opioid use disorders, mental health, and other
15 diseases and conditions. However, there is no clear statutory benefit
16 category to allow Medicaid coverage for PDTs. In light of the promise of
17 PDTs for the treatment of patients with substance use and opioid use
18 disorders during the coronavirus pandemic, this legislation would
19 require that the New York state department of health seek guidance from
20 the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services relative to a coverage
21 and reimbursement pathway for PDTs, in order to accelerate access to
22 such therapies for enrollees.

5 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
