- AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to including the commissioner of addiction services and supports as a member of the disaster preparedness commission

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 21 of the executive law, as 2 amended by chapter 176 of the laws of 2013, is amended to read as 3 follows:

4 1. There is hereby created in the executive department a disaster 5 preparedness commission consisting of the commissioners of transportation, health, division of criminal justice services, education, economic б development, agriculture and markets, housing and community renewal, general services, labor, environmental conservation, mental health, 7 8 9 addiction services and supports, parks, recreation and historic preservation, corrections and community supervision, children and family 10 services, homeland security and emergency services, and people with 11 developmental disabilities, the president of the New York state energy 12 13 research and development authority, the superintendents of state police 14 and financial services, the secretary of state, the state fire adminis-15 trator, the chair of the public service commission, the adjutant general, the office of information technology services, and the office of 16 victim services, the chairs of the thruway authority, the office for the 17 aging, the metropolitan transportation authority, the port authority of 18 New York and New Jersey, the chief professional officer of the state 19 20 coordinating chapter of the American Red Cross and three additional 21 members, to be appointed by the governor, two of whom shall be chief 22 executives. Each member agency may designate an executive level officer 23 of that agency, with responsibility for disaster preparedness matters, 24 who may represent that agency on the commission. The commissioner of the 25 division of homeland security and emergency services shall serve as 26 chair of the commission, and the governor shall designate the vice chair

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1 of the commission. The members of the commission, except those who serve 2 ex officio, shall be allowed their actual and necessary expenses 3 incurred in the performance of their duties under this article but shall 4 receive no additional compensation for services rendered pursuant to 5 this article.

6 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
