AN ACT to provide small businesses affected by COVID-19 an additional 90 days to pay certain premiums for workers' compensation insurance

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary, for the duration of any mandatory or precautionary order of quarantine or isolation issued through an executive order from the governor or
by the state of New York, the department of health, local board of
health, or any governmental entity duly authorized to issue such order
due to COVID-19, small businesses shall have an additional 90 days to
pay any workers' compensation insurance premiums which become due during
such time. Non-payment of such premiums shall not constitute grounds for
cancellation of any workers' compensation insurance policy. For purposes
of this act, "small business" shall mean a business which is resident in
this state, independently owned and operated and who employs one hundred
full-time equivalent employees or less.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
