AN ACT to amend the emergency tenant protection act of nineteen seventy-four and the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to prohibiting the rent guidelines board from increasing rents on certain leases during a state disaster emergency

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Section 4 of section 4 of chapter 576 of the laws of 1974, 2 constituting the emergency tenant protection act of nineteen seventyfour, is amended by adding a new subdivision b-1 to read as follows:
- b-1. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a rent 5 guidelines board shall not increase the rent for any lease with a one year term during and for one year following the conclusion of any state disaster emergency declared pursuant to article two-B of the executive law.

- 9 (2) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary , a rent 10 guidelines board shall not increase the rent for any lease with a two 11 year term during any state disaster emergency declared pursuant to article two-B of the executive law, and for one year following the conclu-12 13 sion of such state disaster emergency the maximum rent increase for any 14 <u>lease with a two year term shall be two percent.</u>
- § 2. Section 26-510 of the administrative code of the city of New York 15 is amended by adding a new subdivision b-1 to read as follows: 16
- 17 b-1. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a rent guidelines board shall not increase the rent for any lease with a one 18 19 year term during and for one year following the conclusion of any state 20 disaster emergency declared pursuant to article two-B of the executive 21
- 22 (2) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary , a rent 23 guidelines board shall not increase the rent for any lease with a two year term during any state disaster emergency declared pursuant to arti-25 cle two-B of the executive law, and for one year following the conclu-

1 sion of such state disaster emergency the maximum rent increase for any 2 <u>lease with a two year term shall be two percent.</u>

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that 4 the amendments to section 26-510 of the rent stabilization law of nine-5 teen hundred sixty-nine made by section two of this act shall expire on 6 the same date as such law expires and shall not affect the expiration of such law as provided under section 26-520 of such law.
