AN ACT to amend the emergency tenant protection act of nineteen seventy-four and the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to prohibiting the rent guidelines board from increasing rents on certain leases during a state disaster emergency

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. Section 4 of section 4 of chapter 576 of the laws of 1974,
