Introduced by COMMITTEE ON RULES -- (at request of M. of A. Reyes) -- read once and referred to the Committee on Health

AN ACT requiring the commissioner of health to ensure all nursing home residents and staff receive COVID-19 testing; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and cited as the "New York Nursing
Home Protection Act of 2020".

§ 2. The commissioner of health shall create and implement a program to ensure that all staff of nursing homes throughout the state are tested twice weekly for COVID-19. Residents shall be tested for COVID-19 on a weekly basis. The department of health shall provide sufficient personal protective equipment (PPE) for all staff and residents and provide for the cost of the testing.

9 § 3. For the purposes of this act, the following terms shall have the 10 following meanings:

(a) "nursing home" shall mean a place to live where care is available for people of all ages, including children, who need twenty-four-hour nursing care and supervision outside of a hospital. Such care shall include basic care and specialized services;

15 (b) "nursing home resident" shall mean a person who resides in a nurs-16 ing home; and

17 (c) "nursing home staff" shall mean a person who is employed by a 18 nursing home.

19 § 4. Necessary funding to implement the program established in section 20 one of this act shall come from existing resources, federal funds, 21 private sources, and appropriations from the general fund.

S 5. This act shall take effect immediately; provided that the provisions of this act shall expire and be deemed repealed upon the expiration of the declared state of emergency relating to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19); and provided, further, that the superintendent of financial services shall notify the legislative bill drafting commission upon the occurrence of the expiration of the state disaster emer-
