AN ACT to amend the public buildings law, in relation to prohibiting the state of New York from selling or displaying symbols of hate

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. The public buildings law is amended by adding a new section 2 146 to read as follows:
- § 146. Prohibit symbols of hate. 1. The state of New York shall not sell or display any symbol of hate or any similar image, or tangible personal property, inscribed with such an image unless the image appears in a book, digital medium, or state museum that serves an educational or historical purpose.
- 8 2. For the purposes of this section, the term "symbol of hate" shall
 9 be symbols of white supremacist and neo-Nazi ideology, including but
 10 not limited to the Battle Flag of the Confederacy, also referred to as
 11 the Stars and Bars.
- 12 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
