AN ACT in relation to requiring the department of labor to provide credit monitoring and identity theft surveillance services to certain individuals whose information may have been disclosed inappropriately

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The department of labor shall provide at least five years of credit monitoring and identity theft surveillance services to all eligible individuals whose personal information may have been inappropriately disclosed by the department. Such credit monitoring services shall be provided at no cost to the eligible individual. For the purposes of this act, "eligible individual" shall mean any person who received a letter from the department of labor dated March 31, 2020, April 2, 2020, April 8, 2020, and April 21, 2020 which related to unemployment benefits.

0 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
