AN ACT to amend the public officers law, the penal law and the civil rights law, in relation to prohibiting the disclosure and publication of the home address or unpublished home telephone number of any active or retired judge or prosecutor

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 89 of the public officers law is amended by adding a new subdivision 7-a to read as follows:

7-a. Nothing in this article shall permit the disclosure or publication of the home address or unpublished home telephone number of any active or retired judge or state or local prosecutor.

§ 2. The penal law is amended by adding two new sections 250.61 and 250.62 to read as follows:

§ 250.61 Unlawful disclosure of the address or telephone number of any active or retired judge or prosecutor in the second degree.

No person shall not knowingly, with reckless disregard for the probability of exposure of another to harassment or risk of harm to life or property, disclose or post or publish on the internet the home address or unpublished home telephone number of any active or retired judge of any court of law of this state, or state, county or municipal prosecutor, or the spouse or child thereof.

Unlawful disclosure of the address or telephone number of any active or retired judge or prosecutor in the second degree is a class A misdemeanor.

§ 250.62 Unlawful disclosure of the address or telephone number of any active or retired judge or prosecutor in the first degree.

A person shall not knowingly, with intent to expose another to harassment or risk of harm to life or property, disclose, post or publish on the internet the home address or unpublished home telephone number of any active or retired judge of any court of law of this state, or state, county or municipal prosecutor, or the spouse or child thereof.

3 § 3. The civil rights law is amended by adding a new section 50-f to  
4 read as follows:

5 § 50-f. Disclosure of address or telephone number of any active or  
6 retired judge or prosecutor prohibited. 1. No person, business, or asso-  
7 ciation shall disclose or post or publish on the internet the home  
8 address or unpublished home telephone number of an active or retired  
9 judge of any court of law of this state, or any active or retired state,  
10 county or municipal prosecutor, or spouse or child thereof under circum-  
11 stances in which a reasonable person would believe that providing that  
12 information would expose another to harassment or risk of harm to life  
13 or property.

14 2. A person, business, or association that violates subdivision one of  
15 this section shall be liable to the active or retired judge or prosecu-  
16 tor, or any other person residing at the home address of such active or  
17 retired judge or prosecutor, who may bring a civil action in the supreme  
18 court.

19 3. The court may award:

20 (a) actual damages, but not less than liquidated damages computed at  
21 the rate of one thousand dollars for each violation of this section;

22 (b) punitive damages upon proof of willful or reckless disregard of  
23 the law;

24 (c) reasonable attorney's fees and other litigation costs reasonably  
25 incurred; and

26 (d) any other preliminary and equitable relief as the court determines  
27 to be appropriate.

28 4. For the purposes of this section, "disclose" shall mean to solicit,  
29 sell, manufacture, give, provide, lend, trade, mail, deliver, transfer,  
30 publish, distribute, circulate, disseminate, present, exhibit, advertise  
31 or offer.

32 § 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
