AN ACT to amend the real property law, in relation to requiring utility corporations to record the existence of certain memorandum of utility surcharge agreements

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 242 of the real property law is 2 amended by adding two new paragraphs (c) and (d) to read as follows:

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(c) A utility corporation shall be required to record a memorandum of 4 any utility surcharge agreement between the utility corporation and a real property owner, within five days of the date such agreement is executed, with the recording officer of the county that the real property is located within. Such memorandum of agreement shall contain at the minimum the information required to be disclosed by a seller to a buyer pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subdivision. The recording officer 10 shall file and record a memorandum of utility surcharge agreement and index such memorandum of agreement under the name of the real property owner, in a book to be kept for that purpose by the recording officer.

(d) For the purposes of this subdivision, "utility corporation" means 14 every corporation, limited liability company, company, association, joint-stock association, partnership and person, their lessees, trustees, or receivers appointed by any court whatsoever, which are engaged 16 in the business of furnishing electric or gas service.

§ 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 18 19 it shall have become a law. Effective immediately the addition, amend-20 ment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implemen-21 tation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made on or 22 before such date.
