AN ACT to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the imposition of civil penalties for violation of state and local laws for building maintenance and operation

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision (a) of section 27-2115 of the administrative 2 code of the city of New York, as amended by local law number 65 of the 3 city of New York for the year 1987, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A person who violates any law relating to housing standards shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than [tem] fifteen dollars nor more than [fifty seventy-five dollars for each [non-hazardous] class A violation, not less than [twenty five] fifty dollars nor more than [the one) two hundred [dollars] and [ten] twenty dollars per day for each [hazardous] class B violation, and fifty dollars per day for each [immediately 10 hazardous] class C violation, occurring in a multiple dwelling containing five or fewer dwelling units, from the date set for correction in 11 12 the notice of violation until the violation is corrected, and not less 13 than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred fifty dollars and, in addi-14 tion, one hundred twenty-five dollars per day for each [immediately 15 hazardous] class C violation, occurring in a multiple dwelling containing more than five dwelling units, from the date set for correction in 16 the notice of violation until the violation is corrected. 17 wilfully making a false certification of correction of a violation shall 18 19 be subject to a civil penalty of not less than [fifty] seventy-five 20 dollars nor more than [two hundred fifty] three hundred dollars for each 21 violation falsely certified, in addition to the other penalties herein 22 provided.

23 § 2. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall 24 have become a law.
