AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to requiring local  
health departments to notify volunteer fire companies upon detecting  
radiation

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assem-  
bly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Article 13 of the public health law is amended by adding a  
2 new title 12-B to read as follows:

### TITLE 12-B

#### NOTIFICATION TO VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANIES

#### OF THE DETECTION OF RADIATION

3 Section 1389-h. Notification to volunteer fire companies of the  
4 detection of radiation.

5 § 1389-h. Notification to volunteer fire companies of the detection of  
6 radiation. County departments of health, local boards of health and any  
7 other office of a municipality as defined by this chapter shall provide  
8 notice to any fire company, as defined by subdivision two of section one  
9 hundred of the general municipal law, serving any location, facility,  
10 site, building or residence, where such entity finds traces of radi-  
11 ation. Such notice, shall be provided within five days of such finding,  
12 shall contain specific details of radioactive samples found, including  
13 level of radiation and level of public health threat, and shall contain  
14 any recommendations for dealing with the radioactive materials in a safe  
15 and sufficient manner during firefighting operations. The commissioner  
16 shall promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary to  
17 effectuate the provisions of this section.

18 § 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall  
19 have become a law; provided that the commissioner of health is author-  
20 ized to promulgate any rules and regulations necessary to implement this  
21 act on or before its effective date.
