AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to enumerating sanctions against persons who sell alcoholic beverages to minors

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The closing paragraph of section 260.20 of the penal law, as amended by chapter 362 of the laws of 1992, is amended to read as follows:

3 Unlawfully dealing with a child in the first degree is a class A 5 misdemeanor and any person who violates the provisions of subdivision two of this section shall, upon first conviction thereof, be punished by 7 a fine of one hundred twenty-five dollars or by imprisonment in a county jail or penitentiary for a term of not less than thirty days nor more 9 than one year or both, and upon a second conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not less than two hundred fifty dollars or by impri-10 sonment in a county jail or penitentiary for a term of not less than sixty days nor more than one year or both, and upon a third conviction 12 thereof shall be punished by a fine not less than three hundred seven-13 14 ty-five dollars or by imprisonment in a county jail or penitentiary for 15 a term of not less than one hundred twenty days nor more than one year 16 or both, and upon a fourth conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not less than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment in a county 17 jail or penitentiary for a term of not less than one hundred eighty days 18 nor more than one year or both, and upon all subsequent convictions 19 20 thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than one thousand 21 dollars or by imprisonment in a county jail or penitentiary for a term 22 of one year or both.

23 § 2. This act shall take effect on the first of November next succeed-24 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
