AN ACT to amend the civil service law, in relation to requiring the department of civil service to create and distribute a pamphlet regarding union membership of civil service employees

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The civil service law is amended by adding a new section 2 154 to read as follows:
- 3 <u>§ 154. Union membership guidance. 1. The department shall create a</u>
 4 pamphlet that sets forth in simple and understandable terms the follow5 ing minimum requirements:
 - (a) The definition of a public employer;

- (b) An explanation that public-sector workers have the right to unionize pursuant to state and local law;
- 9 (c) The prohibition of public employers interfering with public-sector 10 employees right to unionize; and
- 11 (d) The loss of benefits to public employees who choose not to join a 12 union pursuant to subdivision two of section two hundred-nine-a of this 13 chapter.
- 2. The department shall distribute to all current civil service
 employees the pamphlet required pursuant to this section. Within thirty
 days of an employee first being employed or reemployed in a civil
 service position, the department shall distribute the pamphlet required
 pursuant to this section to such employee.
- 19 <u>3. The department shall make available on its website the pamphlet</u> 20 required pursuant to this section.
- § 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed on or before such effective date.
