AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to authorizing the use of opioid antagonists by persons or entities for opioid overdose prevention

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (a) of subdivision 3 of 2 section 3309 of the public health law, as amended by chapter 68 of the laws of 2016, is amended and a new subparagraph (v) is added to read as follows:

(iv) "Opioid antagonist recipient" or "recipient" means a person at 6 risk of experiencing an opioid-related overdose, or a family member, friend or other person in a position to assist a person experiencing or 8 at risk of experiencing an opioid-related overdose, or an organization registered as an opioid overdose prevention program pursuant to this 10 section or [a school district, public library, board of cooperative 11 educational services, county vocational education and extension board, 12 charter school, non-public elementary and/or secondary school in this 13 state] any person or entity or any person employed by [such district, 14 library board or school the person or entity.

(v) As used in this section, "entity" includes, but is not limited to, 16 a school district, public library, board of cooperative educational 17 <u>services, county vocational education and extension board, charter</u> 18 school, non-public elementary or secondary school, restaurant, bar, retail store, shopping mall, barber shop, beauty parlor, theater, sport-20 <u>ing or event center, inn, hotel or motel.</u>

1 § 2. Subdivision 4 of section 3309 of the public health law, as 2 amended by chapter 68 of the laws of 2016, is amended to read as 3 follows:

- 4. (a) Use of an opioid antagonist pursuant to this section shall be considered first aid or emergency treatment for the purpose of any statute relating to liability.
- 7 (b) A recipient, opioid overdose prevention program, [school district, public library, board of scoperative educational services, county voca9 tional education and extension board, charter school, non-public elemen10 tary school and/or secondary school in the state] person or entity, or 
  11 any person employed by [such district, public library, board or school under this section] the person or entity, acting reasonably and in good 
  12 faith in compliance with this section, shall not be subject to criminal, 
  14 civil or administrative liability solely by reason of such action.
- 15 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
