Introduced by M. of A. BUCHWALD -- read once and referred to the Committee on Higher Education

AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to establishing a pilot program for the dispensing of hearing aids in the county of Westchester; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new article 17
2 to read as follows:

ARTICLE 17

DISPENSING OF HEARING AIDS; COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER

3 Section 1700. Dispensing of hearing aids; county of Westchester.

4 § 1700. Dispensing of hearing aids; county of Westchester. 1. The
5 county of Westchester shall establish and implement an comprehensive
6 pilot program to provide for the dispensing of hearing aids pursuant to
7 the provisions of this section. Such pilot program shall continue for a
8 period of five years after the effective date of the chapter of the laws
9 of two thousand nineteen that added this article.

10 2. An audiologist or hearing aid dispenser licensed under article one
11 hundred fifty-nine of the education law employed by an otolaryngologist
12 practicing otolaryngology in the county of Westchester who has conducted
13 a medical evaluation of hearing loss may dispense hearing aids for
14 profit provided that the otolaryngologist who has conducted a medical
15 evaluation of hearing loss provides to the patient a list containing the
16 name and office location of five hearing aid dispensers with a place of
17 business located within the county of Westchester and a written state-
18 ment disclosing that the otolaryngologist's office will receive a profit
19 from the sale of any hearing aid device.
