AN ACT to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to prohibiting the self-certification of project plans in certain situations

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section BC 3302.1 of the New York city building code is amended by adding a new definition for "ADJOINING OWNER", in appropriate alphabetical order, to read as follows:

4 <u>ADJOINING OWNER. An owner whose property shares a property line with</u>
5 <u>that of a developer or an owner of a historic property within a lateral</u>
6 <u>distance of ninety feet from a developer's property line.</u>

- § 2. Section BC 3302.1 of the New York city building code is amended by adding a new definition for "DEVELOPER", in appropriate alphabetical order, to read as follows:
- DEVELOPER. Any individual or business entity filing for a project permit from the department of buildings.
