AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to requiring the teaching of courses in the prevention of child abuse at private schools

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 803-b of the education law, as added by chapter 187 of the laws of 2019, is amended to read as follows:

1. All pupils in grades K-8 in all public and private schools in the state shall receive instruction designed to prevent child sexual exploitation and child sexual abuse. Such program shall be defined by the commissioner in regulations after consultation with the department of health and be designed to educate students, parents and school personnel about the prevention of child sexual exploitation and child sexual abuse in grades kindergarten through eight. Such program shall include, but not be limited to students and parents. Nothing in this section shall prevent the department from making model curriculum and resource materials available on the department's website.

13 § 2. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the same 14 manner as chapter 187 of the laws of 2019, takes effect.
