AN ACT to amend the public officers law, in relation to requiring legislators and candidates for member of the legislature to provide a link to their financial disclosure statements on their official state and campaign websites

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The opening paragraph of paragraph (k) of subdivision 2 of section 73-a of the public officers law is designated subparagraph (i) and two new subparagraphs (ii) and (iii) are added to read as follows:

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- (ii) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, all members of the legislature who maintain any state website for service in their official capacity shall establish a clearly visible link entitled "MY FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS" on the front page of their website which shall direct website visitors to current and past financial disclosure forms that the legislator has submitted to the joint commis-10 sion on public ethics.
- 11 (iii) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, 12 every candidate for member of the legislature who maintains any website 13 for service in their official campaign capacity shall establish a clear-14 ly visible link entitled "MY FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS" on the 15 front page of their campaign website which shall direct visitors to current and past financial disclosure forms that the candidate has 16 submitted to the joint commission on public ethics, in accordance with 17 paragraph (a) of this subdivision. 18
- 19 § 2. The opening paragraph of paragraph (a) of subdivision 2 of 20 section 73-a of the public officers law, as amended by section 5 of part A of chapter 399 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as follows: 21
- 22 Every statewide elected official, state officer or employee, member of 23 the legislature, legislative employee and political party chairman and

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1 every candidate for statewide elected office or for member of the legislature shall file an annual statement of financial disclosure containing 3 the information and in the form set forth in subdivision three of this 4 section. Every member of the legislature and candidate for member of the legislature must file their annual statement of financial disclosure 6 <u>electronically in an electronic, readable, searchable and downloadable</u> **format.** On or before the fifteenth day of May with respect to the 7 preceding calendar year: (1) every member of the legislature, every 9 candidate for member of the legislature and legislative employee shall 10 file such statement with the legislative ethics commission which shall 11 provide such statement along with any requests for exemptions or deletions to the joint commission on public ethics for filing and 13 rulings with respect to such requests for exemptions or deletions, on or 14 before the thirtieth day of June; and (2) all other individuals required 15 to file such statement shall file it with the joint commission on public 16 ethics, except that: 17



With respect to clients represented in other matters, where disclosure of a client's identity is likely to cause harm, the reporting individual shall request an exemption from the joint commission pursuant to paragraph (i-1) of subdivision nine of section ninety-four of the executive law, provided, however, that a reporting individual who first enters public office after July first, two thousand twelve, need not report clients or customers with respect to matters for which the reporting individual or his or her firm was retained prior to entering public office.

To the extent 38 39 that the reporting individual, or his or her firm, provided legal representation with respect to an initial public offering, and federal law or 40 41 regulations restricts the disclosure of information relating to such 42 work, the reporting individual shall (i) disclose the identity of the 43 client and the services provided relating to the initial public offering 44 to the office of court administration, who will maintain such informa-45 tion confidentially in a locked box; and (ii) include in his or her 46 response a statement that pursuant to this paragraph, a disclosure to 47 the office of court administration has been made. Upon such time that 48 the disclosure of information maintained in the locked box is no longer restricted by federal law or regulation, the reporting individual shall 49 50 disclose such information in an amended disclosure statement in response 51 to the disclosure requirements of this paragraph. The office of court 52 administration shall develop and maintain a secure portal through which information submitted to it pursuant to this paragraph can be safely and 54 confidentially stored. With respect to clients represented in other 55 matters not otherwise exempt, the reporting individual may request an exemption to publicly disclosing the name of that client from the

1 commission pursuant to paragraph (i-1) of subdivision nine of section ninety-four of the executive law, or from the office of court administration. In such application, the reporting individual shall state the following: "My client is not currently receiving my services or seeking my services in connection with:

- (i) A proposed bill or resolution in the senate or assembly during the reporting period;
- (ii) A contract in an amount totaling \$10,000 or more from the state or any state agency for services, materials, or property;
- 10 (iii) A grant of \$10,000 or more from the state or any state agency 11 during the reporting period;
- (iv) A grant obtained through a legislative initiative during the 13 reporting period; or
- (v) A case, proceeding, application or other matter that is not a 15 ministerial matter before a state agency during the reporting period."

In reviewing the request for an exemption, the joint commission or the 17 office of court administration may consult with bar or other professional associations and the legislative ethics commission for individ-19 uals subject to its jurisdiction and may consider the rules of professional conduct. In making its determination, the joint commission or the office of court administration shall conduct its own inquiry and shall 22 consider factors including, but not limited to: (i) the nature and the 23 size of the client; (ii) whether the client has any business before the 24 state; and if so, how significant the business is; and whether the 25 client has any particularized interest in pending legislation and if so 26 how significant the interest is; (iii) whether disclosure may reveal trade secrets; (iv) whether disclosure could reasonably result in retaliation against the client; (v) whether disclosure may cause undue harm 28 to the client; (vi) whether disclosure may result in undue harm to the attorney-client relationship; and (vii) whether disclosure may result in an unnecessary invasion of privacy to the client.

The joint commission or, as the case may be, the office of court 33 administration shall promptly make a final determination in response to such request, which shall include an explanation for its determination. The office of court administration shall issue its final determination within three days of receiving the request. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or any professional disciplinary rule to the contrary, 38 the disclosure of the identity of any client or customer in response to this question shall not constitute professional misconduct or a ground 40 for disciplinary action of any kind, or form the basis for any civil or 41 criminal cause of action or proceeding. A reporting individual who first 42 enters public office after December thirty-first, two thousand fifteen, 43 need not report clients or customers with respect to matters for which 44 the reporting individual or his or her firm was retained prior to enter-45 ing public office.
