AN ACT to amend the general municipal law, in relation to facilitating school districts in purchasing local agricultural products

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraphs (b), (b-1) and (c) of subdivision 9 of section 103 of the general municipal law, paragraphs (b) and (c) as amended and paragraph (b-1) as added by chapter 90 of the laws of 2017, are amended to read as follows: (b) [the amount that may be expended by a school district in any

6 fiscal year for such purchases shall not exceed an amount equal to twen-7 ty cents multiplied by the total number of days in the school year 8 multiplied by the total enrollment of such school district;

9 (b-1) the amount that may be expended by a board of cooperative educa-10 tional services in any fiscal year for such purchases shall not exceed 11 an amount equal to twenty cents multiplied by the total number of days 12 in the school year multiplied by the number of students receiving 13 services by such board of cooperative educational services at facilities 14 operated by a board of cooperative educational services;

15 (ϵ)] all such purchases shall be administered pursuant to regulations promulgated by the commissioner of education. Such regulations shall: be 16 developed in consultation with the commissioner of agriculture and 17 18 markets to accommodate and promote the provisions of the farm-to-school 19 program established pursuant to subdivision five-b of section sixteen of 20 the agriculture and markets law and subdivision thirty-one of section 21 three hundred five of the education law as added by chapter two of the 22 laws of two thousand [two] <u>one</u>; ensure that the prices paid by a 23 district or board of cooperative educational services for any items so 24 purchased do not exceed the prices of comparable local farm products

Section 103 of the general municipal law is amended by adding a

16 new subdivision 17 to read as follows: 17. (a) When a board of education, on behalf of a school or school 17 district, advertises an offer for bids, it may include in its specifica-18 19 tions language favoring local or regional procurement where proximity to 20 the offeror is reasonably related to the performance of the services or 21 the provision of the goods, including the type or quality of goods, 22 being sought. (b) Upon a determination by the board of education advertising such a 23 24 bid that the goods or services included in such an offer are not avail-25 able locally or regionally, any language specifying proximity to the 26 offeror shall be waived until the next contract for such goods or 27 services is let out for bid. 28 (c) In the event that a board of education receives no acceptable bids 29 it may waive the language specifying proximity to the offeror and shall 30 award a contract in accordance with other applicable statutes. 31 3 3. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 32 have become a law. Effective immediately the addition, amendment, 33 and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation 34 of this act on its effective date are authorized and directed to be made 35 by the commissioner of the department of agriculture and markets in 36 consultation with the commissioner of the department of education on or

37 before such effective date.
