AN ACT to amend the correction law, in relation to the definitions of a sexually violent offender and sex offense as applied to out-of-state offenders

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subparagraphs (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (d) of subdivi-2 sion 2 of section 168-a of the correction law, subparagraph (ii) as 3 amended by chapter 11 of the laws of 2002 and subparagraph (iii) as 4 amended by chapter 232 of the laws of 2008, are amended to read as 5 follows:

6 (ii) [a felony in any other jurisdiction for which the offender is 7 required to register as a sex offender in the jurisdiction in which the 8 conviction occurred or, (iii)] any of the provisions of 18 U.S.C. 2251, 9 18 U.S.C. 2251A, 18 U.S.C. 2252, 18 U.S.C. 2252A, 18 U.S.C. 2260, 18 10 U.S.C. 2422(b), 18 U.S.C. 2423, or 18 U.S.C. 2425, provided that the 11 elements of such crime of conviction are substantially the same as those 12 which are a part of such offense as of the date on which this subpara-13 graph takes effect.

14 § 2. Paragraph (b) of subdivision 3 of section 168-a of the correction 15 law, as amended by chapter 11 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as 16 follows:

(b) a conviction of an offense in any other jurisdiction which includes all of the essential elements of any such felony provided for in paragraph (a) of this subdivision [or conviction of a felony in any other jurisdiction for which the offender is required to register as a

21 sex offender in the jurisdiction in which the conviction occurred].

22 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
