AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to bias-related graffiti

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 485.05 of the penal law, as
2 amended by section 9 of part NN of chapter 55 of the laws of 2018, is
3 amended to read as follows:
