AN ACT to amend the parks, recreation and historic preservation law, in relation to access to state parks and recreational facilities by persons with a disability without charge

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The parks, recreation and historic preservation law is 2 amended by adding a new section 13.22 to read as follows:
- § 13.22 State park and recreational facility access; persons with a disability. 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contraty, the office shall provide to a person with a disability access to all state parks and recreational facilities under the jurisdiction of the office or other state agency, entitling such person and his or her immediate family to a pass to such state parks and recreational facilities without the charge of any admission.
- 2. The pass for persons with a disability shall be available at regional park headquarters and such other places as the office shall designate. Such pass shall be issued in a manner and form to be determined by the office that shall be sufficient to identify the holder as disabled and shall be valid for the life of such person.
- 3. For the purposes of this section, "disability" means (a) a physical, mental or medical impairment resulting from anatomical, physiological, genetic or neurological conditions which prevents the exercise of a normal bodily function or is demonstrable by medically accepted clinical or laboratory diagnostic techniques or (b) a record of such an impairment or (c) a condition regarded by others as such an impairment.
- 21 <u>4. The office shall promulgate such rules and regulations as may be</u> 22 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.
