AN ACT to amend chapter 53 of the laws of 2019, enacting the aid to localities budget, in relation to state HIV rental assistance funding

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 53 of the laws of 2019, enacting the 2 aid to localities budget, is amended by repealing the items hereinbelow set forth in brackets and by adding to such section the other items underscored in this section.

8 Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of law, for state reimbursement of a 9 program in social services districts with 10 11 a population over five million for shelter 12 supplements in order to prevent eviction 13 and to address homelessness in accordance 14 with a plan approved by the office of temporary and disability assistance and 15 the director of the budget. Expenditures 16 17 for such shelter supplements for individ-18 uals and families in receipt of safety net 19 assistance shall be reimbursed at percent by this appropriation.
