AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to treatment alternatives for pain causing conditions

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Section 3331 of the public health law is amended by adding 2 a new subdivision 9 to read as follows:
- 9. (a) When a patient seeks treatment for any neuromusculoskeletal condition that causes pain, a practitioner shall refer, discuss and/or prescribe any of the following nonpharmacological treatment alternatives, based on the practitioner's clinical judgment and following generally accepted national professional or treatment guidelines, before starting a patient on an opioid: acupuncture, chiropractic, massage therapy, physical therapy or occupational therapy.
- (b) This subdivision shall not apply to the use of opioids for patients being treated under any of the following circumstances: treatment of cancer; hospice care; medical treatment in a long-term care facility; post-surgery treatment immediately following a surgical procedure; or in a medical emergency situation. For purposes of this article, a "medical emergency situation" shall mean an acute injury or illness

16 that poses an immediate risk to a person's life or long-term health.

17 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
