AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the practice of veterinary medicine

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 6701 of the education law, as amended by chapter 268 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:

2 268 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:

§ 6701. Definition of practice of veterinary medicine. The practice of the profession of veterinary medicine is defined as diagnosing, treating, operating, or prescribing for any animal disease, pain, injury, deformity or dental or physical condition, or the subcutaneous insertion of a microchip intended to be used to identify an animal. "Animal" includes every living creature except a human being. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, no provisions of this section shall be construed to include the floating of equine teeth or the use of non-medical Food and Drug Administration class I registered devices, including but not limited to pulsed electromagnetic field therapy as being within the practice of veterinary medicine.

14 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
